

A report on retail sales also boosted investor confidence. Excluding spending on autos, gas and building supplies, retail sales rose more than forecast by economists.

Meanwhile, Republican Sheriff Jim Vlahakis will seek a second four-year term as sheriff. Candidates have until March 25 to file their nominating petitions. The primary election will be held June 3.

BOARD OF TRADE



CHICAGO (AP) — Grain futures were mixed Tuesday on the Chicago Board of Trade. Wheat for March delivery was 5.75 cents higher at \$5.7925 a bushel; March corn was 3 cents lower \$4.3150 a bushel; March oats fell 2.75 cents to \$3.9025 a bushel; while March soybeans advanced 12.75 cents to \$13.07 a bushel. Beef and pork were higher on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange. February live cattle rose 1.05 cents to \$1.3765 a pound; March feeder cattle was .35 cent higher \$1.6682 a pound; while February lean hogs rose .63 cent to \$.8600 a pound.


