opportunities for his office. He said he hopes to soon have access to a computer program that allows county-level officers to have direct access to VA files. However, the county must first approve the purchase of the program, he said.

"It's something I hope we can take advantage of," McDonald said.

The veterans service officer said he also wants to coordinate at least two reach-out events this year, as many veterans are unaware of the benefits they are entitled to and the services offered by the county's office.

One of the most overlooked actions by veterans is the filing of DD-214 documents, or discharge papers, McDonald said.

"When I got out of the military, I knew it was important to file my discharge papers, and I did it right away," he said. "But I have met several people in just a week who've never done that, and now they have to request their discharge papers from the National Archives in St. Louis."

Discharge papers are necessary to receive a variety of services, McDonald said, such as benefits, VA home loans and veterans preference during search for employment.

"You have to prove you gave credible services to get those benefits," he said. "And that's just a very simple thing that every vet should take care of within the first week of when they get home."

The Yankton County Veteran Services Office is located on the second floor of the Yankton County Government Center at 321 W. Third Street. The office is open from

1-5 p.m. on Mondays and 9 a.m.-5 p.m. on Tuesdays and Wednesdays. For more information, contact McDonald at michael@co.yankton.sd.us or 605-260-4400 ext. 8.

"VA bureaucracy can be pretty maddening, and I'm going to do the best I can to work for you," McDonald said. "If I don't know the answer, I'll try my hardest to find out."

- Democrats Thursday night strongly objected to a proposed bill to ban voter registration at the polls on election days.
- Governor Archie Gubbrud has set the week of January 27 as "South Dakota Inventors Week" and called attention to the third annual South Dakota Inventors Congress which is scheduled for January 31 through February 2, in

Aberdeen. More than 100 inventions were on display during the 1963 event. This year the inventors will compete for some \$1,500 in cash awards as well as attractive ribbons in eight divisions: sweepstakes, agriculture, automotive, household, electrical, sports and recreation, tools and miscellaneous.

BOARD OF TRADE

CHICAGO (AP) — Grain futures were mostly higher Thursday on the Chicago Board of Trade. Wheat for March delivery was 5 cents higher at \$5.7275 a bushel; March corn was 2.25 cents lower \$4.28 a bushel; March oats rose 6.75 cents to \$3.9975 a bushel; while March soybeans fell 3 cents

to \$13.15 a bushel. Beef and pork higher on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange. April live cattle rose .27 cent to \$1.3922 a pound; March feeder cattle was .23 cent higher \$1.6825 a pound; while April lean hogs rose .70 cent to \$9.225 a pound.
