Summit Surprise: First Place Up For Grabs Today At The DakotaDome

Don't look now, but first place is up for grabs today (Saturday) in the DakotaDome. Sure, it may be early in the Summit League men's basketball race, but the fact that the University of South Dakota and Fort Wayne are both unbeaten so far makes today's 4 p.m. showdown intriguing. Not only intriguing, though, but surprising.

Fort Wayne, picked sixth in the pre-season poll, stands alone in the men's standings at 3-0 (15-5 overall). The Coyotes, picked seventh in the pre-season poll, are 2-0 after Thursday night's 12-point win over IUPUI.

It's still very early in the 14-game league schedule for both teams, but the Mastodons are already the talk of the conference (after winning 16 games all of last season). They beat North Dakota State and South Dakota State on the opening weekend and beat Denver - the preseason No. 2 team - on the road Thursday night.

Personally, I'm not sure what to make of USD at this point, because today's game will mark the third consecutive league game at home. If the Coyotes are able to pick up a couple wins on the road, than I would put more stock into their early rise.

If, however, USD is able to muster the kind of defensive performance today we've seen through its first two league games, than the Covotes could be able to beat Fort Wavne and climb into first place. North Dakota State and South Dakota State are both off to 2-1 starts in the Summit, and you would

Nebraska Hires Air Force Aide As Secondary Coach
