PBS Won't Move 'Downton' Closer To British Run

PASADENA, Calif. (AP) — Despite some fans eager to see it earlier, "Downton Abbey" will continue to begin its new seasons on PBS in January, the system's chief executive said on Monday.

The return of "Downton Abbey," which began its fourth season on Jan. 5, is becoming a post-holiday tradition for the show's fans, said Paula Kerger, PBS president. The British series began presenting new episodes in late September back home, but PBS holds it back. The drama had more than 10 million viewers for its fourth-season debut, and the episode was streamed online 1 million times during the following week, she said.

Debuting PBS' most buzz-worthy show at the same time it starts in Britain will put it in direct competition with the new season offerings from the broadcast networks, Kerger said. It is also easier to get cast members to the U.S. to promote the new season if they don't have to worry about those duties in Britain at the same time.

"It would be very hard for me to imagine putting it anywhere else than where it has seemed to have found a very strong audience," she said.

Public broadcasters are open to experimenting with different ways of distribution, however. Some PBS stations have tried showing programs online before they appear on television, she said.

2 Nabbed At Texas Border In Credit Card Fraud Case

McALLEN, Texas (AP) — Account information stolen during the Target security breach is now being divided up and sold off regionally, a South Texas police chief said Monday following the arrest of two Mexican citizens who authorities say arrived at the border with 96 fraudulent credit cards.

McAllen Police Chief Victor Rodriguez said Mary Carmen Garcia, 27, and Daniel Guardiola Dominguez, 28, both of Monterrey, Mexico, used cards containing the account information of South Texas residents. Rodriguez said they were used to buy tens of thousands of dollars' worth of merchandise at national retailers in the area including Best Buy, Wal-Mart and Toys R Us.

"They're obviously selling

the data sets by region," Rodriguez said.

Garcia and Guardiola were both being held Monday on state fraud charges. It was not immediately known whether they had retained lawyers.

The local police began working with the U.S. Secret Service after a number of area retailers were hit with fraudulent purchases on Jan. 12. The Secret Service confirmed that the fraudulent accounts traced back to the original Target data breach from late last year. Investigators fanned out to McAllen-area merchants and reviewed "miles of video" looking for the fraudsters, Rodriguez said. From that, they were able to identify two people and a car with Mexican license plates.

Also harming Congress is the influence of outside groups, Thune said. Such groups have led to increasingly polarized politicians, as elected officials don't want to lose the support of their backers. This has hurt both Congress' reputation and productivity, he said.

"Some outside group is scoring every vote you make, and if you don't vote their way, they're going to go recruit somebody to run against you in a primary," Thune said. "There are other reasons too, but that's one of the issues today in modern politics that influences the debates in Congress. It makes it harder for people to come together and solve problems."

Turning to the economy, Thune said regulations having a significant impact on South Dakota are those tied to the Dodd-Frank Act, which was signed into law in 2010 in response to the late-2000s recession.

The banking regulations were designed to rein in systemically risky financial institutions that were "too big to fail," he said, but the same rules are having a negative effect on smaller banks, such as numerous community banks in South Dakota.

"The cost of complying with all these regulations is incredibly burdensome and, in

some cases, is probably going to put some banks out of business," Thune said.

The senator added that such an impact often happens when Congress overreacts to a situation.

"You can swing the pendulum so far back the other way it sometimes becomes a bigger problem," he said. "I think you have to try to be reasonable, look at works and what ultimately is effective."

When asked about his thoughts on proposed increases to the minimum wage, Thune said he believes such an action would likely result in numerous job losses. This could particularly affect teenagers and South Dakotans who are seasonal or part-time workers, he said.

"Any time you raise the cost of doing business in this country, it will cost somebody jobs," Thune said. "To me, the more important question is what kind of policies we can put in place that will encourage the hiring of more people, which will grow the economy, because that raises the wage levels for everybody."

The senator also was asked if he is considering a presidential run in 2016. While he wouldn't rule it out, he said he is focused on his current duties.

"I've got plenty of work to do in the Senate," Thune said.
