- A Washington's Birthday ball will be held on the evening of February 20 sponsored by and for the benefit of the "Spirit of '76," the boys life and drum corps which has attracted a large amount of local and some national attention during the past year or more.

50 YEARS AGO

Tuesday, January 21, 1964

- "Hector" the armadillo is at his liveliest (for a nocturnal creature) when he's being fed at the Wildlife Management Laboratory at South Dakota State college. Paul Springer, associate professor of wildlife management, and Nelle

Hartwig, professor of entomology-zoology received "Hector" as a gift during the recent holiday season. Miss Hartwig believes "Hector" to be one of the few armadillos north of Texas and describes him as "so homely he's cute."

- Larry Hutchinson, White River, was named the South Dakota outstanding young farmer of the year. Hutchinson, a farmer for 14 years, started with a loan from his father. He operates 4,880-acres of land of which he owns 4,400 acres.

25 YEARS AGO

Saturday, January 21, 1989
