WALL ST. RECAP

Stocks fell again on Monday as shaky economies and currencies in emerging markets continued to fuel a global downturn.

Fearful investors pushed prices lower across Asia and Europe, though the drops weren't as steep as last week. In the U.S. and in other rich countries, where economies are healthier, investors are also in retreat, but the selling has moderated.

**ON MONDAY:**

The Dow Jones industrial average fell 41.23 points, or 0.3 percent,

to close at 15,837.88.

The Standard & Poor's 500 index fell 8.73 points, or 0.5 percent, to 1,781.56.

The Nasdaq composite fell 44.56 points, or 1.1 percent, to 4,083.61.

**FOR THE YEAR SO FAR:**

The Dow is down 738.78 points, or 4.5 percent.

The S&P 500 is down 66.80 points, or 3.6 percent.

The Nasdaq is down 92.98 points, or 2.2 percent.

Wheat for March delivery fell 1.75 cents to \$5.6350 a bushel; March corn was 2.25 cents higher \$4.3175 a bushel; March oats rose 4.50 cents to \$4.0075 a bushel; while March soybeans advanced 3

cents to \$12.8775 a bushel.

Beef mixed and pork were higher on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange.

PICKSTOWN — South Dakota tribal governments will meet to exchange ideas to improve transportation safety at the fourth annual Tribal Transportation Safety Summit on Jan. 29-30 at the Ft. Randall Casino & Hotel Conference Center in Pickstown.

The opening session of the two-day summit offers each of South Dakota's nine tribes a chance to share a transportation safety best-practice or success story. That could be a law enforcement effort, a highway safety program or a social program that is improving transportation safety on that reservation.

The summit also will focus on effective crash reporting, work zone safety, transit safety and traffic-safety programs, resources and assistance available to tribes from various state, federal and non-profit agencies and groups.

Anne Ferro, administrator for the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration, will be addressing the participants during the summit. The overall goal of the summit is to increase awareness of specific tribal transportation safety issues and gain a better understanding of the needs of each South Dakota tribe.
