DWU Wrestling Coach To Step Down

MITCHELL — After five years as the head coach of the Dakota Wesleyan University wrestling team, Matt Sedivy is stepping down after the 2013-14 season wraps up in March, DWU Athletic Director Curt Hart announced on Tuesday.

Sedivy, who was hired as the Tigers' head coach in 2009-10, is resigning to pursue a career in business in his home state of Nebraska. In his five seasons at the helm, he led Dakota Wesleyan to four top-five finishes in the Great Plains Athletic Conference standings, and his 2013-14 squad is currently first in the league with a 3-0 mark.

In four-plus seasons, Sedivy, who graduated from DWU in 2006 and served as a student coach during his time as a student at the university, is 26-31 with four duals left on the schedule for this season.
