By now, you're probably tired of hearing people talk about 'how good' the Missouri Valley Football Conference has been during the 2014 season.

And yes, that season continues into 2015 with a historic first in the FCS ranks. Three-time defending national champion North Dakota State (14-1) and Illinois State (13-1) will meet in Saturday's FCS championship game down in Frisco, Texas, marking the first time in FCS history that two teams from the same league meet in the final.

And oddly enough, it's a meeting between the league co-champs who did not meet during the regular season.

## MVFC Continues To Add To FCS Bragging Rights

With that in mind, there had to come a time when both sides hoped to see the other with the title at stake? "To be honest, I was hoping back in August," Illinois State head coach Brock Spack joked during Monday's championship teleconference. "I didn't know if we were going to be good enough to get to that spot," he added. "Absolutely we've cheered for them."

As has the rest of the league, which is nearing the end of a historic season.

The Valley finished the season with a 30-2 record against non-conference FCS teams, with the only losses on the road to Montana (against the University of South Dakota) and Chattanooga (against Indiana State in the playoffs).

The league also has a record nine playoff wins, besting the previous record of eight by the Colonial Athletic Association in three different years. Saturday's outcome down in Texas only guarantees that the Val-

ley will get a 10th playoff win. Three other MVFC teams also reached the playoffs, as you've read by now: South Dakota State, Northern Iowa and Indiana State, and all three won at least one game.

"It validates what our conference has been saying the last four or five years," Spack said.

Thing is, the league's success also goes beyond the FCS ranks. North Dakota State and Indiana State both upset an FBS team last fall, the Bison against Iowa State and the Sycamores against Ball State. Though Illinois State did not play a 'guarantee game' this season, Spack is all too familiar with the 'top level' of life that the MVFC couldn't regularly compete at that level.

"I can tell you, I spent 22 years of my life in FBS football, and I would not want to schedule one of our teams if I was one of those guys," Spack said.

Yankton native Layne Somsen, a former South Dakota State standout who now pitches in the Cincinnati Reds organization, will host a pitching and catching clinic in conjunction with the Mount Marty College baseball program on Sunday, Jan. 11 at Laddie E. Cimpl Arena.

The session for ages 13-18 will be from noon-3:30 p.m., with the session for ages 9-12 running from 4-6:30 p.m.

This camp will provide instruction in pitching and catching. Players will get the opportunity to work with Layne Somsen and Mount Marty College coaching staff and players. The advanced instruction provided is designed to enhance campers' skills. Campers will be given insight, instruction, and drills that college and pro players use to develop their talents. Each participant will receive a camp t-shirt. Participants will need to bring gloves and athletic shoes for indoor use (no spikes). Catchers will need to bring catcher's gear (mask, shin guards, and chest protector).

Somsen was selected by the Cincinnati Reds in the 22nd round of the 2013 First-Year Player Draft out of SDSU. He was named 2013 Summit League Pitcher of the Year after going 4-5 with one save and a 1.87 ERA. Somsen helped the SDSU Jackrabbits reach the NCAA Tournament for the first time in the Division I level and finished his career ranked fourth on the school's all-time list in starts (38), strikeouts (180) and innings pitched (215).

the ball by Scooby Wright, giving the Wildcats the 31-24 win.

Afterward, senior cornerback Ifo Ekpre-Olomu, who decided to stay at Oregon for a final year in part to give a national championship one more shot, was the voice of reason.

"Every loss is a test of our character to see how we respond. Not every team in college football is going to go undefeated so everyone has to learn from their losses and get better," he said.

There was talk that Mariota hadn't been 100 percent in the loss, which he shrugged off as "typical football stuff." In the Heisman Trophy-winning quarterback's typical even-keel style, a week afterward he — and the rest of the Ducks — had refocused.

"There's no sense of panic or anything like that," Mariota said at the time. "I think guys are understanding we've just got to take it one game at a time."

Taking that cue from their unquestioned leader, it was a sentiment the Ducks carried through the rest of the season.

"The loss was a big part of it. That's not something that we do, so we just reassessed everything, went back to the drawing boards and came back more physical. We were able to bounce back and knew we had to play more physical and play a lot harder than we have been," running back Byron Marshall said.

On Monday, the Ducks held a media day back home in Eugene, where they'll practice before heading to the Dallas area on Friday in preparation for the title game.

Coach Mark Helfrich was asked about the Arizona loss, and how the Ducks overcame that disappointment. He chalked it up to the process.

"We believe very much in what we're doing. Our guys believe very much in what we're doing and how we're doing it," Helfrich said. "There's always — from the media's perspective or the fans' perspective — second-guessing. In our world that's evaluation. "You go back and evaluate why something happened. And you fix it."
