BROOKINGS — The Climate Prediction Center temperature and precipitation climate outlook released Jan. 1, 2015 shows cooler weather likely to make an extended stay, explained Laura Edwards, SDSU Extension climate

field specialist. "There were some hints of this coming a couple of weeks ago, but now it is official," Edwards said. "Following a warmer than average December, the first couple of weeks of January will feel frigid, to both humans and livestock alike.'

LIVESTOCK PRODUCERS **NEED TO PREPARE**

Edwards said the weather will prove challenging for the state's livestock producers as they work to ensure their livestock are in areas that are protected from wind and have sufficient access to water and feed. "During the coldest days of the year, energy requirements will increase for all classes of livestock," she said. "Although it is not part of the outlook, windier conditions are also likely.'

For additional information on livestock energy needs in cold weather, Edwards encouraged livestock producers to reference Grow.org. "There will be

Based on body condition scoring, Edwards said producers will be able to monitor animal health to ensure

the climate forecast also appears to be mostly dry for the early to middle part of January, snow removal and moisture or mud in feedlots and as well as on animal coats will most likely not be an issue. "If the animals can be kept dry, this will reduce their vulnerability to hypothermia and the energy they need to keep warm, she said.

Based on the current outlook, Edwards said that by mid-month, the coldest weather will be behind us at least for a while — and warmer and drier conditions should come across the state. "At that time feed rations can again be re-evaluated, as we look towards late winter and calving season to begin," Edwards said. To learn more, visit


