Knox County Sheriff Don Henery has hired a new Knox County Deputy Sheriff effective Jan. 2, 2015.

Andrew Filipps grew up Knox County and attended school in Crofton, Nebraska. Andrew graduated from Crofton High School in 2003. Andrew is married and his wife, Erin, is also from the Crofton area. They have been married 4 years and have a 15 month old daughter. Andrew's hobbies include hunting, fishing and competitive shooting.

Andrew has been a member of the Nebraska National Guard since 2003 and continues to serve. During his time in the guard, Andrew deployed to Iraq from 2005 to 2007 and then again to Afghanistan in 2010 and 2011. Andrew also worked full time for the Nebraska National Guard from 2009 to 2011. After returning from Afghanistan in 2011, Andrew was hired by the Canton Police Department in South Dakota and completed training 2012. Andrew was employed with the Canton Police Department for over 3 years, and is a certified law enforcement officer in South Dakota. That certification will be transferred to Nebraska via the reciprocity between the two states.

Andrew will be stationed in the Wausa, Nebraska, area but will serve all of Knox County. The hiring of Andrew brings the Sheriff's Office back to full staff with deputies stationed in the Creighton, Verdigre, Bloomfield and Center areas.

The driver and passenger were not injured. Both were wearing seatbelts and the airbags did not deploy. The 2005 Ford F150 was totaled. The ATV received minimal damage.

At 6:47 p.m. Dec. 30, 2014, the Knox County Sheriff's Office received a report of a vehicle/cow accident approximately 4 miles north of Crofton, Nebraska. A south-bound 2006 Chevrolet pickup, driven by Shelby Arens, 23, rural Crofton, struck a red bred heifer belonging to Keith Buschkamp, of rural Crofton, as Mr. Buschkamp was attempting to put it back in. Both the heifer and the pickup appeared to have narrowly missed hitting Mr. Buschkamp after impact and no injuries were reported at the time of the investigation. The pickup was totaled and the heifer killed as a result of the impact.
