But with more than enough votes at their command, Republican and Democratic supporters said they hoped the legislation could win final approval and be sent to the White House by the end of next

"President Obama has every reason to sign the jobs and infrastructure bill that we will pass," said Senate Majority Leader Mitch McConnell of Kentucky. He noted that the Nebraska Supreme Court had recently rejected a legal challenge brought by opponents, an obstacle the White House had cited.

Sen. Brian Schatz, D-Hawaii, made the case for the opposition. He said that if constructed, the pipeline would carry "some of the dirtiest, most dangerous and most polluting oil in the world." He called the project "anti-clear water, anti-clear air, anti-public health."

The proposed 1,179-mile pipeline would begin in Canada, enter the United States at Morgan, Montana, cut across South Dakota and connect with an existing pipeline in Steele City, Nebraska, that in turn reaches refineries along the Texas Gulf Coast. It would carry an estimated 800,000 barrels of crude oil a day.

The White House has repeatedly threatened a veto. If Obama follows through, it will become the first of what are expected to be numerous clashes with the Republican majorities now in control of both houses of Congress.

Since Congress convened on Jan. 6, the White House has issued a total of five veto

threats, including two Monday. By bringing the legislation to a vote swiftly after taking over the Senate majority, Republicans hope to achieve two goals at once.

the state constitution and

state statutes. Two other states — Arkansas and Missouri — already have appealed similar federal district court rulings to the 8th Circuit. The U.S. Supreme Court again is considering whether to hear a gay marriage case, and more appeals court rulings — especially if they conflict could increase the likelihood the justices will do so.

In November, the 6th Circuit Court of Appeals based in Cincinnati became the first appellate court to recently uphold state bans on samesex marriage. Plaintiffs from Kentucky, Michigan, Ohio and Tennessee are asking the court to reverse that decision. Four other appeals courts — based in Chicago, Denver, San Francisco and Richmond, Virginia — have ruled in favor of gay and lesbian couples. Arguments over bans in three Southern states were held last week before a New Orleans-based appellate court.

Presently, 36 states allow same-sex couples to marry, nearly twice as many as just three months ago.

The South Dakota couples' attorney, Josh Newville, said this represents the last opportunity for the state's elected officials to be on the right side of history" by not appealing Schreier's deci-

"I would say that Attorney General Jackley needs to consider very seriously the amount of money that he's pouring into this lawsuit on behalf of the state to keep a discriminatory law in place,' Newville said.

Five of the couples already married in Iowa, Connecticut and Minnesota. Nancy Rosenbrahn, of Rapid City, married her longtime partner in April in Minneapo-

"On one hand, this is like the best present ever," Rosenbrahn said of the decision Monday. "On the other hand, you go back and you say 'Well, yeah, it should be a yes' because we are no different than anybody else. There is no reason to say we can't get married, there is no valid reason to do that anymore."
