

Ohio State Could Fuel Impending Big Ten Renaissance

Ohio State's thrashing of Oregon in the title game was more than just an ego boost for the Big Ten.

It may have also signaled an impending renaissance for a league that looked finished four months ago.

The Big Ten was the only league in the country to beat three ranked teams in bowl games — and that was before Ohio State's victory over the Ducks. The conference was also the only one with two teams in the top five of the final poll released Tuesday.

The Buckeyes were a unanimous No. 1, and Michigan State was tied for fifth after stunning Baylor in the

Cotton Bowl.

And the recent influx of high-profile coaches like Ohio State's Urban Meyer and Michigan's Jim Harbaugh could have the Big Ten poised for big things in the years to come.

"I do think there's a little bit of a reset. With the strength of the coaches, that's a factor," Big Ten commissioner Jim Delany said.

The argument over whether the conference has finally caught up to the SEC, the Big 12 and the Pac-12 will continue all offseason.

In September, it wasn't much of an argument. On one weekend, Virginia Tech stunned the Buckeyes, Oregon throttled the Spartans and Notre Dame embarrassed Michigan.

Many experts declared that the conference was out of the running for a

playoff spot.

What a difference a few months make.

Michigan just committed roughly \$35 million to Jim Harbaugh.

Michigan State has won the Big Ten title game, the Rose Bowl and the Cotton in the past 13 months. New coaches at Wisconsin (Paul Chryst) and Nebraska (Mike Riley) could push those perennial league contenders over the hump, and Jerry Kill has things looking up at Minnesota.

Don't forget Penn State. The sanctions are ending and the Nittany Lions look ready to rebound under James Franklin.

In the near future, all those programs will probably be chasing the Buckeyes.

Ohio State is set to bring back the majority of its starters and could have three proven starting quarterbacks: Cardale Jones, J.T. Barrett and Braxton Miller.

Harbaugh's track record suggests that Michigan could be back in the national spotlight sooner than later.

Stanford was in way worse shape than the Wolverines are when Harbaugh took over in 2007. But he led the Cardinal to a 12-1 record and the Orange Bowl title in his fourth season before a successful stint with the San Francisco 49ers.

Still, Michigan has to worry about reclaiming its own state first.

Michigan State has won at least 11 games in four of the past five seasons. Its 21-point comeback against

Baylor further silenced whispers that its success was largely a product of a weak league.

In the West division, Kill has led once-mediocre Minnesota to back-to-back eight win seasons.

Wisconsin beat Auburn in the Outback Bowl, hired a seemingly perfect fit to replace Gary Andersen in former offensive coordinator Paul Chryst and finished 13th in the final poll.

Nebraska's decision to fire Bo Pelini was also something of a good sign for the league. It was proof that the Huskers don't plan on settling for anything less than national title contention in the years to come.

"I was cheering like mad for Wis-

Boys' Basketball: Scotland Edges Past Avon 34-32

SIOUX FALLS — The top-ranked Sioux Falls Lincoln Patriots out-scored the Yankton Bucks by 13 points after half-time to claim a 59-43 boys' basketball win on Tuesday night at Lincoln High School.

Addison Park scored 20 points and grabbed seven rebounds for the Patriots (6-1), who led 23-20 at halftime and made 50 percent of their shots (10-of-20) in the final two quarters.

Kaleb Johnson added 12 points, and Malik Dunn posted nine points and seven rebounds in the win.

For the Bucks (5-3), Brady Hale scored 20 points on 5-of-13 shooting, also going 6-of-6 at the free throw line. Tanner Frick added nine points, four rebounds and four assists, while Austin Johnson scored seven points.

"I thought our kids played hard; had good effort, but ultimately we had too many turnovers," Yankton coach Chris Haynes said.

Yankton returns home to host Pierre on Friday night as part of a doubleheader. The biggest thing the Bucks need to focus on?

"We have to handle pressure better," Haynes said. "Pierre does the same thing (as Lincoln), and they've got quick guards and they want to turn you over."

In sub-varsity action Tuesday, Yankton won the sophomore game 58-51 thanks to 27 points from Jordan Payer.

In the freshman game, Lincoln won 47-37. Trevor Raftery scored seven points for the Bucks.

Cirillo Named Volleyball Coach At SDSU

BROOKINGS — Nicole Cirillo has been hired as the head volleyball coach at South Dakota State University, Director of Athletics Justin Sell announced today. Cirillo previously served as associate head coach at IUPUI.

Cirillo, who becomes SDSU's 12th volleyball coach, has spent the last five years as an associate head coach for the Jaguars. During her tenure, Cirillo was part of four of the best seasons in IUPUI volleyball history as it won three Summit League regular-season titles, played in three consecutive Summit League Tournament title games, won the 2013 Summit League tournament championship, advancing to the program's first NCAA Tournament.

As IUPUI's recruiting coordinator, Cirillo recruited and coached multiple Summit League award-winning student-athletes both on and off the court.

During her five years as

assistant coach at Missouri Southern state, Cirillo worked directly in the development of the squad's middle blockers, helping

MSSU reach the South Central Regional Tournament and a top-25 American Volleyball Coaches Association (AVCA) ranking in 2006.

Cirillo also was the club director for the Ozarks Juniors Volleyball Club and served as a head coach for several USA Volleyball Juniors teams.

During her four-year collegiate career, Cirillo served as a team captain at Southwestern Illinois College (2000-02) and the University of Central Arkansas (2002-04).

A native of Edwardsville, Ill., Cirillo was first-team all-conference and all-metro player at Edwardsville High School, earning player of the year honors on the all-area

team while leading EHS to regional and sectional championships. She was an honorable-mention all-America and a first-team all-region selection at Southwestern Illinois College, where she played the first two years of her collegiate career before transferring to UCA.

At Central Arkansas, Cirillo played in 173 games and logged 409 kills, 125 blocks (27 solo) and 62 service aces. In 2003, she helped the Sugar Bears to their first Gulf South Conference Tournament appearance since 1998. Cirillo, a team captain, was also named to the GSC Academic Honor Roll.

Cirillo earned her bachelor's degree in management information systems from UCA in 2004 and her masters of science in administrative studies from Missouri State in 2006.

The former Nicole Shoger is married to Kiley Cirillo and they have two sons, Kale and Daxton.

SIOUX FALLS — Third-ranked Sioux Falls Lincoln raced out to a 30-point half-time lead on the way to a 70-45 girls' basketball victory over Yankton on Tuesday night in Sioux Falls.

"They came out and shot the ball really well in the first half, and got us in a little bit of a hole," Yankton coach Trey Krier said. "We just continue to really not be able to put the ball in the basket."
