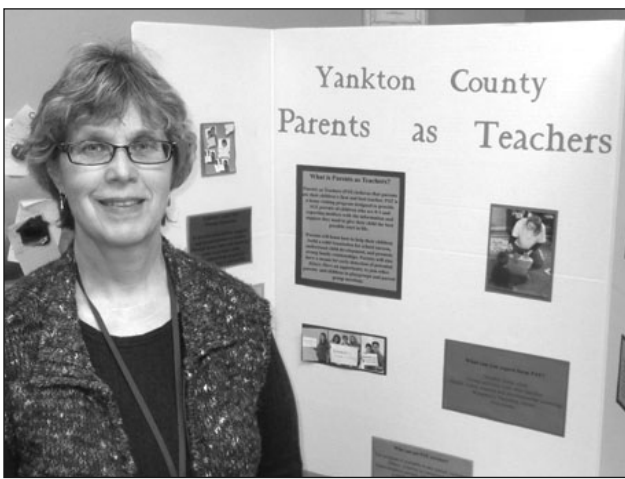
# PAT Of Yankton Co. Provides Home Support

Parents As Teachers recently welcomed our newest Coordinator/Educator, Deanna Branough. Deanna is a local resident who recently retired from the South

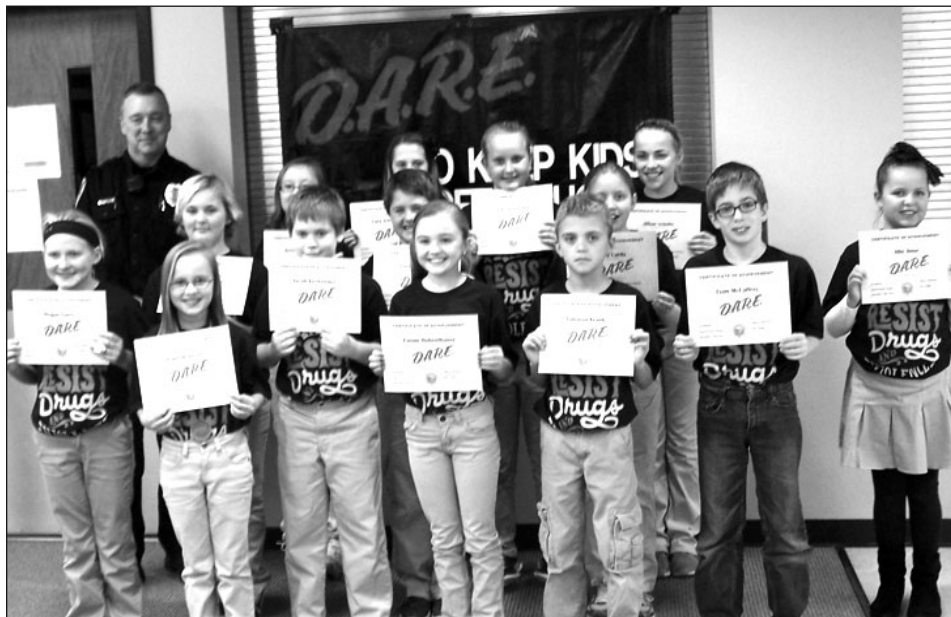

## Local Food Producers Meet To Discuss Potential Food Hub

More than producers of edible foods in southeastern South Dakota took advantage of an opportunity last week to discuss the topic of food hubs. Meetings so far have been held in Brookings, Wagner, Parker and Yankton. Topics included the general concept of a food hub, operations and structure options and time for questions and answers. Genuine interest was shown in continuing the conversation.

Through an SDSU Extension grant from USDA's Agricultural Marketing Service, producers are able to come together to plan for a food hub here over the next year. Pieces of the plan include

setting up a legal structure, identifying potential customers, setting up aggregation sites, planning transportation routes, and recruiting a food hub manager.

A final meeting for producers will be held on Monday, Jan. 19, at 4:30 p.m. at JoDean's Steakhouse in Yankton. Light refreshments will be served, with meals available. Any interested producers are urged to attend to be included in further conversations.

## Bald Eagles Days Set For Jan. 24-25

Bald Eagle Days, a free public event sponsored by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers and the National Park Service, is set for Saturday and Sunday, Jan. 24-25, at the Lewis and Clark Visitor Center.

This year, presenters from SOAR Raptors of Dedham, Iowa, will be on hand to give raptor education programs. There will be special displays, handouts and activities for the kids.

The programs will take place at: 9 a.m., 11 a.m., 1 p.m. and 3 p.m. each day. The programs will feature several live raptors.

"These programs fill up fast so we recommend that people arrive at least 30 minutes earlier than the scheduled presentation," said Park Ranger Karla Zeutenhorst. Seating will be available on a first come, first serve basis. Reservations are not accepted.

In addition to the programs, the visitor center will have spotting scopes set up for viewing eagles along the river, eagle displays and trivia, informational handouts, and a children's activity table.

The Lewis and Clark Visitor Center is located 4 miles west of Yankton on Nebraska Highway 121 just above Gavins Point Powerplant. The center is handicapped accessible and will be open from 8 a.m. to p.m. each day for this event.
