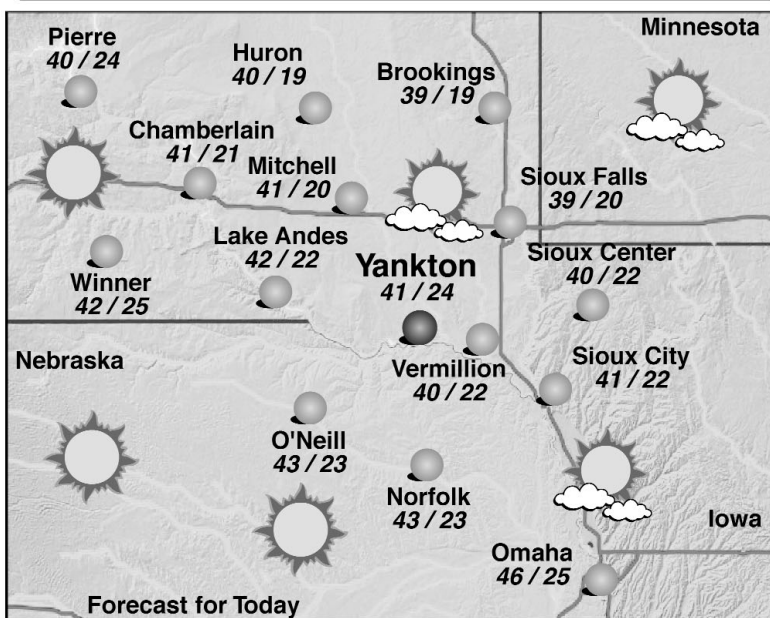

Beresford Officer Placed On Administrative Leave After Shooting Thursday

BERESFORD — A Beresford police officer has been placed on administrative leave after he shot a man Thursday who approached him with a gun, according to authorities.

Sgt. Dave Steckelberg was involved in the incident, which remains under investigation, according to a press release from South Dakota Attorney General Marty Jackley.

In the news release, Jackley and Beresford Police Chief Larry Christensen confirmed a Beresford police officer responded to a call for service at approximately 12:07 p.m. Thursday. The police officer responded to a residence located at 101 N. 13th Street in Beresford.

Preliminary reports indicate Steckelberg arrived at the scene and observed a male subject exit the front door and approach the officer with a gun. The officer drew his weapon and shot the subject.

The male subject, identified as 21-year-old Christopher Lee Heuer of Sioux Falls, was transported to a local hospital where he was treated for non-life threatening injuries.

Steckelberg and all other occupants of the house were not injured in the confrontation, according to the press release.

Steckelberg was placed on administrative leave following the incident.

The investigation into the event has been turned over to the South Dakota Division of Criminal Investigation (DCI). Further inquiries regarding the investigation will be referred to the South Dakota Attorney General's office.

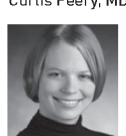
