A change involving co-op affiliation has changed two teams' rankings. Dakota Christian disolved its co-op with Platte-Geddes to form an all-sports co-op with Andes Central. PGDC was in 9AA and Andes Central was in 9A the past two years.

Parker, Marty Indian, Irene-Wakonda and Marion-Menno all dropped from 9AA to 9A. Scotland moved up from 9B to 9A. Freeman dropped from 9AA to 9B.

Vermillion (11A), Dakota Valley (11A), Beresford (11B), Elk Point-Jefferson (11B), Parkston (11B) and Wagner (11B) remained in their

Gayville-Volin (9A), Avon (9B)

and Centerville (9B) all remained in their same classes in 9-man.
