• ONE of the following to prove identity, date of birth, and lawful status: Certified U.S. birth certificate issued by county or state (no hospital birth-cértificatés); valid`unexpired U.S. passport; Certificate of Naturalization; Certificate of Citizenship; valid unexpired permanent resident card; valid unexpired employment authorization document; foreign passport with valid unexpired U.S. Visa with I-94

If your name is different than the náme on your identity document, you will need to bring additional proof of your legal name. Acceptable documents for proof of legal name change are a certified marriage certificate (issued by a state vital records agency), a certified adoption document, or a certified court order authorizing a name change (such as a divorce decree). If you have had multiple marriages, you will need to bring similar documents providing legal proof of each name change. The examiners must be able to trace from your birth

name to your current name. ONE document to prove your Social Security number: Social Security card, W-2 Form, SSA 1099 Form, Non-SSA 1099 Form, pay stub (must include name and Social Security number). The regulations do not allow personnel to accept any other document as proof of So-

cial Security number.

• TWO documents to prove your residential address. A parent's proof of address is acceptable for a minor child. Bring two of the docu-ments listed here (each must contain your current address): Utility bill, credit card statement, pay stub or earnings statement, rent receipt, phone bill, transcript or report card from accredited school, bank state-ment, mortgage document, tax dochomeowners/renter's insurance policy. Other items will be reviewed by licensing personnel. PO Box addresses are acceptable in areas not assigned street or 911 addresses. 
