The volleyball program at Mount Marty College in Yankton might just be at a crossroads. Does it continue its upward trajectory, riding the momentum from the 2014 season? Or does the program slide back? It's a question that has suddenly come up, following the news reported by the Press & Dakotan in Tuesday's paper that Mount Marty head coach Candice Climer is stepping down after five seasons she finished her doctorate degree and will teach full-time at Mount Martv. Climer, a 2005 graduate of the NAIA college, was hired in 2010 and slowly started to build the program up to its current level of at least competing on a regular basis in the Great Plains Athletic Conference. It's not been easy, though. It took some time. She began to incrementally improve her recruiting

classes, while also developing those kids she had in-house.

The seniors on the 2014 roster were in Climer's first recruiting class and played key roles in help-

ing the Lancers not only win four GPAC matches last season (the most since 2006), but reach the conference tournament — the first time since 2010.

Looking forward, however, there doesn't figure to be a massive drop-off in talent. No, Mount Marty returns three all-conference players, including second team libero BreAnne Thege and honorable mention hitters Allison Cross and Sierra Kloth, as well as 11 other players who saw varsity experience.

With Climer gone, where does Mount Marty go next to ensure that its volleyball program doesn't regress? The unfortunate part of all of this is that the head coaching position is now a part-time gig. Make no mistake, the position will attract interest (perhaps some in-house candidates?), and as we saw with the men's basketball opening two years ago, Mount Marty isn't exactly going to rush. And really, there's no reason to hurry this along.

Either way, Mount Marty can thank Climer for building the program to where it is now, a conference tournament team with pieces in place to make return trips. She and her recruits have made volleyball relevant again at the school, and whomever is hired to take the reins certainly isn't faced with an empty cupboard.
