**USD's Hertting, Schutt Honored By Summit League**

ELMHURST, Ill. — Sophomores Sam Schutt and Greysen Hertting earned the Summit League Swimmer and Diver of the Week honors, respectively, for the period ended Jan. 25. Schutt was named Summit League Swimmer of the Week for the sixth time of her career and the fifth time this season. The sophomore was victorious in every event she competed, accumulating eight event titles during the span of two dual meets. During Friday's dual with South Dakota State, Schutt won the 100-meter (58.59), 200-meter (2:07.62) and 400-meter (4:28.25) individual freestyle events. She also anchored the 400-meter medley relay. In the relay, Schutt dove into the pool three strokes behind the South Dakota State anchor, but split 57.65 seconds in the freestyle leg to win the opening relay for the Coyotes. Schutt returned Saturday to break a six-year-old pool record and set a new school record in the 800-meter freestyle when she touched in at 9:11.32 in the dual versus North Dakota. Schutt then clocked times of 58.58 seconds in the 100 free and 4:28.82 in the 400 free to win all three individual events. She also swam a leg on the winning 400-

meter freestyle relay. Hertting earns Summit League Diver of the Week honors for the 19th time in her career and ninth time this season. The sophomore recorded a score of 320.33 points in the three-meter dive in Friday's dual versus South Dakota State to best her own school record of 301.50 set earlier this season. Hertting's score also broke a six-year-old DakotaDome pool record. Hertting added a win in the one-meter dive with 239.48 points. Saturday, she returned in the dual versus North Dakota to sweep the women's boards, taking the three-meter in 312.68 and one-meter in 281.03. The Coyotes compete at their final meet of the regular season on Friday, Feb. 6, at the Minnesota Challenge in Minneapolis, Minn. Denver's Dylan Bunch and Ross Edfort earned men's swimming and diving honors.

MITCHELL — Former Tiger athlete Derik Fossum has been promoted from his assistant coach role to the take over the teams, it was announced by DWU Athletic Director Curt Hart on Tuesday. Fossum, 25, will take over the teams immediately with the 2014-15 indoor track season currently ongoing. The teams have competed in three meets so far this season with Fossum leading the teams. Fossum is a former Great Plains Athletic Conference triple jump champion, winning the title with a leap of 46 feet, 8.75 inches at the league's indoor

Upon graduation, Fossum returned to DWU as an assistant under former Head Coach Patrick Belling, who resigned from the team in December of last year after eight years with the program. Fossum worked with Belling as an assistant with the track and field team working primarily with the school's jumpers. Former DWU All-American runner Thomas Madut will join Fossum to work with the cross country and track distance runners as an assistant. The coaching staff will also include graduate assistant Eric Larson for track and field and cross country, while assistant coach Jeff Holstein and graduate assistant Bryan Burke will work with the track and field team.

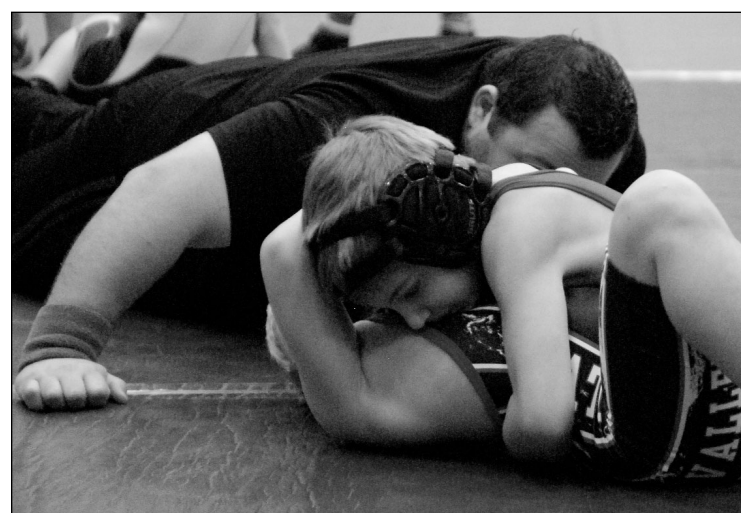
**USF's St. Pierre Adds To Awards List**
