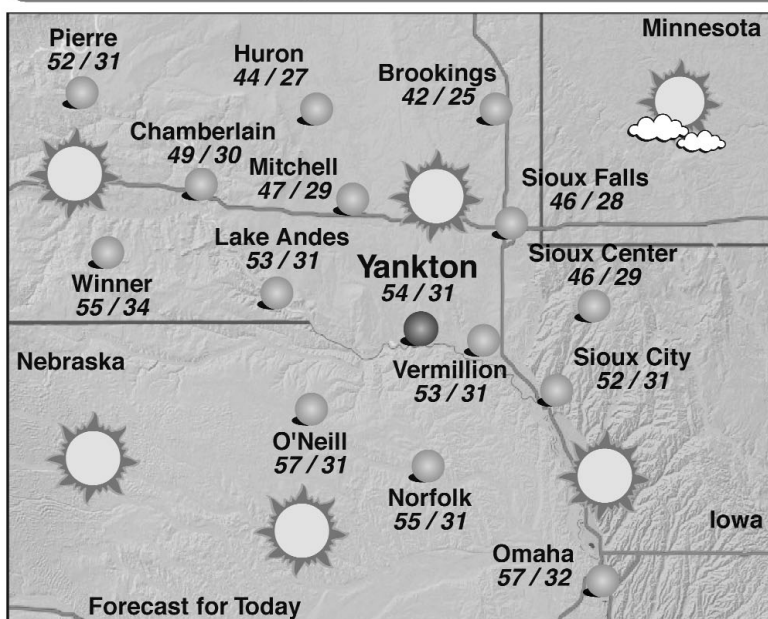

SD Shakespeare Festival Seeking Actors For 'Macbeth' Performance

VERMILLION — The South Dakota Shakespeare Festival (SDSF) seeks non-equity performers for its third outdoor season of free Shakespeare in Vermillion's Prentis Park. This year's production will be "Macbeth" and will be held June 11-14. Rehearsals will begin May 18.

The festival seeks actors and teaching artists from the Great Plains region and nationally to form an ensemble-based Shakespeare company for a four-week contract in Vermillion. All positions are paid. Actors coming from out of town will be eligible for local housing and a travel stipend.

The SDFS is also seeking children from the local community for unpaid apprenticeship positions in the acting company. Local auditions will be held Monday, Feb. 2, from 6-9 p.m. at Warren M. Lee Center for Fine Arts on the University of South Dakota campus in Vermillion. Prepare one or two contrasting Shakespeare monologues, and bring a photo and resume. Callbacks will be held at USD on Feb. 9, by appointment.

Children are also being sought for unpaid apprenticeship positions in the acting company. Children should attend this local audition, accompanied by an adult. Children can audition with a prepared monologue or read from the script.

MMC Students To Help With Tax Returns

For the 21st year, Mount Marty College students will assist members of the community with preparing their individual tax returns without charge.

Students enrolled in the tax clinic course will help prepare required federal and state tax returns for low-income clients.

The students will meet with each client for an initial interview then prepare the necessary tax returns. A second, short appointment will be conducted with each client to go over the results of the tax returns before filing. If a client is determined to require more advanced tax services, they will be asked to seek a professional tax preparer.

Each tax return will go through a verification process to ensure accuracy before being returned to the client for filing.

At the conclusion of the tax return preparation process, the client will be given a paper return to mail to the Internal Revenue Service along with a full and complete copy for their personal records. No data relative to any tax returns will be maintained by Mount Marty College or the students providing this service.

CHICAGO (AP) — Grain futures were lower Tuesday on the Chicago Board of Trade.

Wheat for Mar delivery fell 1.25 cents to \$5.19 a bushel; Mar corn lost 2.75 cents to 3.8125 a bushel; Mar oats were 1.5 cents lower at \$2.8925 a bushel; while Mar soybeans declined 9.75 cents to \$9.7375 a bushel.

Beef gained and pork fell on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange.

Apr live cattle was up 3 cents to \$1.51 a pound; Mar feeder cattle rose 3.85 cents to \$2.0382 a pound; while Apr lean hogs were 0.6 cent lower at \$7.205 a pound.

An unexpected drop in U.S. orders of long-lasting goods also weighed on the markets.
