# Gazelles Win Third Straight Yankton Improves To 5-5 In ESD Play, Hosts Mitchell On Friday

HURON — Lindsey Hale continued her hot shooting from outside as the Yankton Gazelles won their third game in a row, 48-42 on Tuesday night in Huron.

Hale scored a team-high 11 points on three 3-pointers, her third consecutive game with at least three 3-pointers. Becky Frick added nine points, while Sophie Drotzmann and Madason Tessier had eight points apiece.

"Lindsay had all 11 of her points in the first half, and Madason had all of hers in the second half," said Yankton head coach Trey Krier. "We're learning how to lean on different girls in different situations. In the first half they played zone and we depended on our shooters. In the second half, when they were in man, we went to our penetrators and post players.'

Yankton (5-8) jumped out to a 24-14 half-time lead and led by double digits most of the second half.

"We had a really good start," Krier said. "Our girls did a really good job of being patient against their zone."

Sarah Carr scored 17 points and grabbed 13 rebounds for Huron (3-9), while Jazmin Newton added eight points and Samantha Zell scored seven points.

Yankton returns home to host Mitchell on Friday night as part of a doubleheader. The Kernels took the first meeting 54-33 on Jan. 3.

"We are excited about Friday," Krier said. "We played Mitchell right after Christmas, and we didn't play well there. We had 40 turnovers against them that night, and had 12 tonight, by far our best in that department this season." Huron won the JV game 34-27. For Yankton, Anna Savey and Linze Cowman each

had seven points. Emily Oswald added six points for the Gazelles.

## Boys' Basketball: YHS Hosts Mitchell On Friday

HURON — The Yankton Bucks survived scoring just one field goal in the fourth quarter to claim a 41-38 victory over Huron in Eastern South Dakota Conference boys' bas-

ketball action on Tuesday. Yankton led 17-12 after one quarter and matched Huron's output in the second and third quarter. The Bucks scored just seven points, but held on for the victory.

"Any time you can come into Huron and win, you'll take it," Yankton head coach Chris Haynes said. "It's never easy to win on the road in the ESD.

Brady Hale scored 15 points to lead Yankton. Tanner Frick had seven points. Evan Greeneway finished with seven rebounds in the win.

Hale, esepcially, was aggressive in the win, according to his coach.

"He played like an all-stater tonight," Haynes said.

For Huron, Peyton Carr finished with 10 points and six rebounds. Hayden Busch, who came in averaging 18 points per game, was held to six points on 2-14 shooting, including 1-9 from three.

Yankton held Huron to 31.3 percent shooting in the game, including just 3-22 (13.6 percent) from three.



The Bucks won the sophomore game 38-37 thanks to Jordan Payer's game-winning three-pointer with 13 seconds left. Cole Lewno added seven points.

And in freshman action, Huron won the 'A' game 51-30. Yankton got eight points from Casey Krejci. The Bucks won the 'B' game 41-25 behind 15 points from Brady Dangler.
