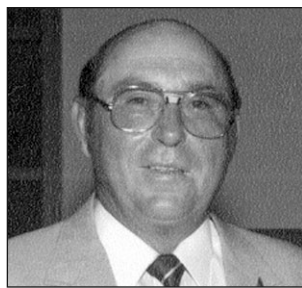
### Allen Auch
