

#### **USD.** Area Athletes Named To SL Fall Academic List

VERMILLION — University of South Dakota placed 60 percent of its list-eligible student-athletes on the 2014-15 Summit League Fall Academic Distinguished Scholars List released Thursday by the league office.

The Coyotes' four fall programs — men's and women's cross country, women's soccer and volleyball — combined for 36 Distinguished Scholars, the highest number in the Summit League in those four sports. IUPUI is second on that list with 34. Fort Wayne and South Dakota State are tied for third with 28 Distinguished Scholars.
