### USD, Wesleyan To Receive HHS Grants

WASHINGTON — The University of South Dakota in Vermillion and Dakota Wesleyan University in Mitchell will receive a total of \$125,614 in federal grants from the Department of Health and Human Services Scholarships for Disadvantaged Students Program, the office of Sen. Tim Johnson (D-S.D.) announced Thursday.

The funding comes from annual federal appropriations with additional money coming from the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009. Funds will be used to give scholarships to health profession students with financial need.

The Scholarships for Disadvantaged Students Program provides grants to schools to give scholarships to students from disadvantaged backgrounds with financial need.

Dakota Wesleyan University will receive \$20,000 for scholarships in its Associate Nursing Program. The University of South Dakota will receive \$48,266 for scholarships in its Associate Nursing Program and \$57,348 for scholarships in its Allopathic Medicine Program.

 • The largest single bond sale in South Dakota's history, a \$7 million issue of rural credit refunding bonds designed to solve the department's refinancing problems for at least six years and result in large interest saving, was announced today by the state rural credit board.

• Back to earth after more than 27 days aloft, Fred and Al Key slept off the effects of a record endurance flight which they said succinctly wasn't "any fun." They broke all existing records for sustained flying. Their record is 7 days, 5 hours and 34 minutes and the official endurance record of 647 hours, 28 minutes and 30 seconds.

**Saturday, July 2, 1960**  
 • A rare move by Congress has assured pay raises for 1 1/2 million government workers. Congress had to sweep aside a veto by President Eisenhower to do it.

• The 1959 census of agriculture conducted last fall shows 1,217 farms in Yankton County. Total land in farms was 307,880 acres.

**Tuesday, July 2, 1985**  
 • Andrei A. Gromyko was elected president of the national Soviet Union Tuesday by the national Parliament and relieved of the foreign ministry post he has held since 1957.

• South Dakota's rural schools are beginning to feel the effect of the poor farm economy, education officials told a congressional hearing, because money to run schools comes from local property taxes. Troubles in the farm economy also hurt enrollment in rural schools as farmers are forced off the land or main street businesses are forced to close, students move to different schools.

#### CHICAGO BOARD OF TRADE

CHICAGO (AP) — Grains futures were mixed Thursday on the Chicago Board of Trade.

Wheat for September delivery jumped 19.5 cents to \$4.9975 a bushel, while September corn rose 10.5 cents to \$3.7225 a bushel and oats for July delivery dropped 13.25 cents to \$2.4175 a bushel. November soybeans added 3 cents to \$9.055 a bushel.

Meanwhile, beef futures fell and pork futures traded mixed on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange.

August live cattle slipped 0.07 cent to 89.95 cents a pound; August feeder cattle lost 0.45 cent to \$1.126 a pound; August lean hogs edged up 0.2 cent to 81.85 cents a pound; and July pork bellies shed 0.4 cent to 99.1 cents a pound.
