#### CHICAGO BOARD OF TRADE

CHICAGO (AP) — Grains futures were mixed Friday on the Chicago Board of Trade.

Wheat for September delivery added 3.25 cents to \$5.03 a bushel, while September corn slipped 0.75 cent to \$3.725 a bushel and oats for July delivery rose to \$2.43 a bushel. November soybeans inched up 0.25 cent to \$9.0575 a bushel.

Meanwhile, beef futures traded mixed and pork futures fell on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange.

August live cattle lost 0.48 cent to 89.47 cents a pound; August feeder cattle added 0.07 cent to \$1.1287 a pound; August lean hogs fell 1.8 cents to 80.05 cents a pound; and July pork bellies shed 0.6 cent to 98.5 cents a pound.

## Hastings To Reimburse EPA For Cleanup

HASTINGS, Neb. (AP) — The city of Hastings will pay \$1 million and contribute \$1.7 million in services to the Environmental Protection Agency as reimbursement for cleanup at one of its contamination sites, according to a settlement awaiting court approval.

The EPA filed a lawsuit and notice of proposed settlement Thursday in U.S. District Court seeking payment for federal costs from cleaning up the old Hastings police station. The EPA spent \$14.1 million to clean up the site, court documents said.

City Attorney Mike Sullivan called the lawsuit a formality. A settlement with the EPA was approved by the city council on Monday, and the lawsuit is needed for a judge to approve the agreement, Sullivan said Friday.

Under the settlement outlined in city documents, Hastings will make five payments totaling \$1 million by Jan. 10, 2014, and contribute \$1.7 million in in-kind services toward cleanup efforts over the next 10 to 13 years. Those services could include removing three buildings at the site, providing security at the site and attending planning meetings.

The city and EPA also will share insurance reimbursements related to the cleanup, according to city documents.

The EPA put the site on its list of the nation's worst Superfund sites in 1986.

get out of the house. Knief complied and the police were contacted. By the time authorities arrived, the suspect had fled the residence.

The fingerprints matching those of suspect Harris-Moore were found in the home.

Police also found evidence that the suspect in that burglary had attempted to break into other neighborhood homes.

DNA evidence has also linked Harris-Moore to the June 19 theft of a white 2008 Toyota Sequoia a few miles east of Yankton. That vehicle was later found in Norfolk, Neb.

Norfolk authorities have issued a warrant for Harris-Moore's arrest based on visual evidence.

According to the Seattle Times, Harris-Moore has been on the run from authorities since April 2008 when he escaped from a Renton, Wash., halfway house. He had been serving time for burglarizing Camano Island homes. Since his escape, he has eluded authorities while allegedly being involved in a rash of thefts in Washington, British Columbia and Idaho. Among the crimes he is believed to have been responsible for are the theft of boats, airplanes and luxury cars, as well as break-ins at homes and businesses.

Harris-Moore has not been suspected in any crimes since last week, when a stolen 2010 Chevrolet was found abandoned in a Dallas City, Ill., creek bed.
