Former S.D. Lt. Gov. Bill Dougherty Dies At 78

SIoux FALLS (AP) — Former South Dakota lieutenant governor and lobbyist Bill Dougherty, known for his ties to the Kennedy family, died Saturday after a long battle with cancer. He was 78.

Dianne Brockberg of Miller Funeral Home in Sioux Falls confirmed Sunday that he passed away at Dougherty Hospice House.

Dougherty was part of the Democratic Party's brief rise in South Dakota in the 1970s. He served as lieutenant governor from 1971 to 1975, under Richard Kneip, the state's last elected Democratic governor. He went on to become a respected lobbyist and worked every session of the Legislature through 2009.

"He had a pretty impressive list of clients, and he was involved in probably every major issue in the Legislature from 1975 to 2009," said his son, Timothy Dougherty.

Bill Dougherty was born April 6, 1923, in Sioux Falls. He started out as a cattle trader, taking over the family business after his father's death.

His first big foray into politics was handling John F. Kennedy's 1960 presidential campaign in

South Dakota.

Timothy Dougherty said his father also ran Robert Kennedy's presidential campaign in the state and possibly Ted Kennedy's too.

"He was always very close to the Kennedys. Whenever they wanted to know what was going on in South Dakota, they would check with Bill," former Sen. George McGovern said.

Dougherty also was one of McGovern's top advisers and traveled with him during his 1972 presidential bid.

"He seemed to enjoy that," McGovern recalled. "He loved to be at the heart of the campaign."

As lieutenant governor, Dougherty presided over the Senate. He infuriated Democrats in 1973 for failing to use his constitutional power to break a Senate deadlock over Kneip's state income tax plan. Kneip had tried four times to get it passed.

A funeral mass is scheduled for Wednesday morning at St. Mary Catholic Church in Sioux Falls. Burial will follow in St. Michael Cemetery.

Dougherty is survived by three adult children. His wife, Louise "Billie" Dougherty, died in 2004.
