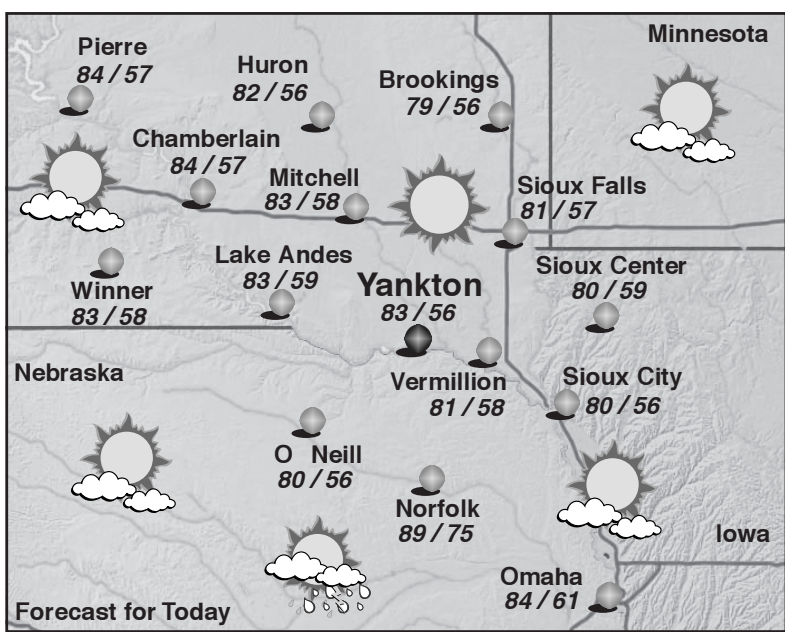

Yankton To Begin Seal Coat Program On Streets Next Week

The City of Yankton Street Department will begin the street seal coat program the week of the July 12 and should be completed in approximately one week, weather permitting.

- The process will be to oil the road and cover it with 3/8-inch chips. The streets will be closed to traffic during the seal coat process and opened to traffic immediately after the application. After 4-6 weeks, the street sweeper will pick up the excess chips that are still loose.
- "No Parking" signs will be placed on the streets the day before they are sealed. Observe these signs and do not park on the streets until the work is done. Do not put grass onto the street before the streets are sealed or permit underground irrigation systems to run water onto the streets while the No Parking signs are up. In the event of rain, the process may be postponed.

 • Mrs. C.K. Makara, nee Katherine Arend, a real pioneer of Dakota Territory, having come to Yankton County with her parents 76 years ago, died Saturday at 2 p.m. at Sacred Heart Hospital at the age of 81 years.

He suffered two knife or razor wounds in the throat and lost considerable blood before being found two and a half hours later.

acreage allotments for 1961 as a result of President Eisenhower's severance of Cuban sugar imports.

Monday, July 8, 1985
 • A light shower this morning failed to reduce the inroads made by the near-century temperatures of early Sunday evening in Yankton. The readings cooled from 90 degrees shortly after 8:30 a.m. to 87 degrees by 9:15 a.m.
 • A helicopter taking sightseers on rides over Mount Rushmore crashed into a wooded hillside as it came in for landing Saturday, killing four of five occupants, authorities said.

CHICAGO BOARD OF TRADE

CHICAGO (AP) — Grains futures rose Wednesday on the Chicago Board of Trade.
 Wheat for September delivery jumped 23 cents to \$5.305 a bushel while September corn climbed 10.25 cents to \$3.7825 a bushel and oats for July delivery rose 5.75 cents to \$2.5375 a bushel. November soybeans surged 32.5 cents to \$9.325 a bushel.
 Meanwhile, beef and pork futures also traded higher on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange.
 August live cattle gained 0.7 cent to 90.5 cents a pound; August feeder cattle inched up 0.03 cent to \$1.1355 a pound; August lean hogs rose 0.55 cent to 80.82 cents a pound; and July pork bellies added 0.5 cent to 99 cents a pound.

over the Internet will be another priority.
 If Nesselhuf has one criticism of the way the office was run during the past eight years under Chris Nelson, it's that it didn't always err on the side of the public.
 "Basically, when you see a gray area, you err on the side of enfranchising people rather than disenfranchising them," Nesselhuf said. "I think Chris has largely been on the other side of that. He has said the rules are the rules."
 One recent case Nesselhuf pointed to was when Nelson disallowed petition signatures to refer the smoking ban to a vote because notaries public listed incorrect information on their notary seal expiration dates on petitions.

Nesselhuf said he would also like to make campaign finance information more readily available to the public and would continue the office's good track record on customer service.
 "It's an incredibly important office," he said. "I've served in the Legislature for 10 years now. In that time, I've discovered that a lot of the issues I'm passionate about: campaign finance reform, elections protection and economic development ... are either caused by or can be resolved by the secretary of state."
