MILITARY

LT. COLONEL JOE KUNKEL ASSUMES COMMAND

The change of command ceremony is rooted in military history dating back to the 18th century during the reign of Frederick the Great of Prussia. At that time, organizational flags were developed with color arrangements and symbols unique to each particular unit. To this flag and its commander, the soldiers of the unit would dedicate their loyalty and trust. When a change of command was to take place, the flag was passed to the individual assuming the command. This gesture was accomplished in front of the unit so that all could see and witness their new leader assuming his dutiful position. He who held the flag also held the soldiers' allegiance. This symbolic tradition has survived throughout military history.

Lieutenant Colonel Sanchez will relinquish command of the 90th Fighter Squadron. This will be symbolized when

Lieutenant Colonel Sanchez passes the squadron guidon to the 3rd Operations Group Commander, Colonel Routt. Colonel Routt will pass the guidon to Lieutenant Colonel Kunkel, who will immediately assume command of the squadron.

Lieutenant Colonel Joe Kunkel was raised in Hebron, Neb. He attended the United States Air Force Academy and was commissioned a Second Lieutenant on June 1, 1994 with a Bachelor of Science degree in Aeronautical Engineering. Following undergraduate pilot training at Vance AFB, Okla. he was assigned to the F-15E Strike Eagle. His past assignment locations include Seymour Johnson AFB, N.C., RAF Lakenheath, United Kingdom, Sheppard AFB, Tex., the Pentagon,

Washington, D.C. and Elmendorf AFB, Alaska.

His previous duties have included assistant operations officer, flight commander, chief of scheduling as well as the executive officer to the Air Force A35. Just prior to his current assignment at Elmendorf AFB, Lt. Col. Kunkel transitioned to the F-22A Raptor. He most recently served as the operations officer for the 525th Fighter Squadron. Lt. Col. Kunkel's combat experience includes numerous deployments in support of combat operations in the Persian Gulf and Baltic Regions. He has a total of 46 combat sorties, 145 combat hours, and has dropped more than 70,000 pounds of air-to-ground ordnance on hostile targets.

Lt. Col. Kunkel is married to the former Jennifer Koerwitz of Deshler, Neb. They have four children: Drew (14), Madeline (12), Brayden (10), and Riley (10). Lt. Col. Kunkel is the son of Tom and Nancy Kunkel of Yankton.

moment required a great deal of patience.

Hansen's shot caught the Meridian Bridge during a now-closed historical window. She shot the 1924 bridge when it stood alone, before the construction of the newer Discovery Bridge.

"I always loved that (Meridian) bridge. I was trying to find where the river was calm and the sky was blue," she said. "But it was hard to find the river when it was calm, and there was a lot of mornings when it was foggy. Then there was a morning when it all came together."

The Memorial Park photo was shot on a foggy morning last October. Hansen said she checks the park during different seasons to capture different looks.

"For my day job, I'm an accountant," she said. "I don't always walk around with a camera, but I do walk around with a camera eye. You don't realize all the things out there."

Artz, a professional photographer, was also restricted in some of the times he could shoot, as he could not include inmates in his photographs.

He went beyond the architecture, seeking a softer look for each structure.

"It's not always the best angle," he said. "I used the lighting, and I captured the framing with the trees."

Pat Hansen knew she wanted two of Yankton's landmarks, Meridian Bridge and the Memorial Park water tower, but shooting them at the right

windows. But you have to time it just right."

The photo has enjoyed many lives, as Mount Marty College - where Sawatzke works - has used the photo in many ways for its calendars and mailings. Interestingly, the photo is the only indoor shot of the 12 selected for the calendar.

"I enjoy outdoor shots, but this is a beautiful building," Sawatzke said.

Jeremy and Rebecca Johnson are not professional photographers. He is a social worker, while she is a freelance graphic designer. Both Johnsons power shot, taking their entries in a short amount of time on one day.

"I went for landmarks and historical buildings. I shot Cramer-Kenyon straight on, from the street, during an afternoon," Rebecca said. "I like Cramer-Kenyon because of the architecture of the building. I live in a home that dates back to the 1900s, so I love older homes."

Jeremy sought to capture Gavins Point Dam as well as Lewis and Clark Lake, Rebecca said.

That was a good choice that helped the entry, Jacobs said. "We wanted pictures of the lake, and photos with the dam outweighed a picture of just the lake," she said.

Rebecca said the couple shoots for fun, each one seeks to come out with the better shots. "It's a friendly little competition, and we were both chosen (for the calendar)," she said.
