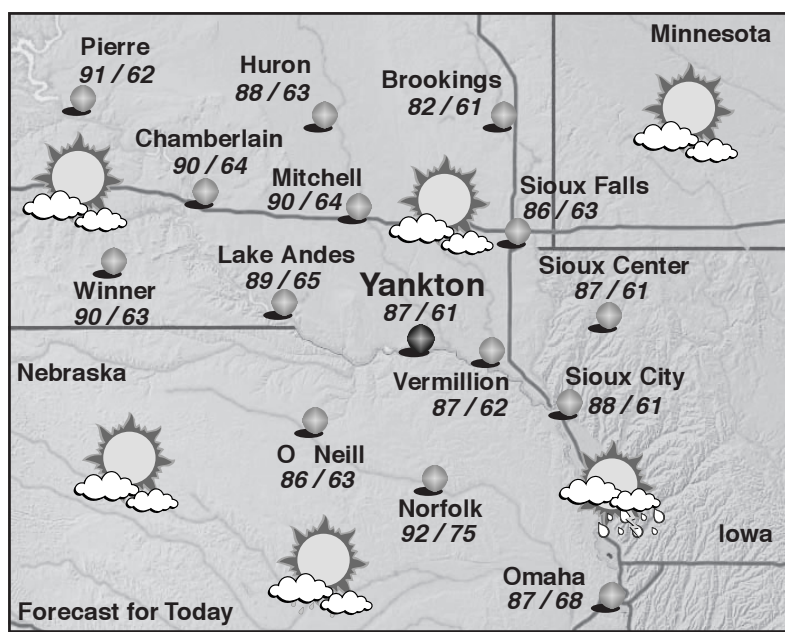

CHICAGO (AP) — Grains futures advanced Wednesday on the Chicago Board of Trade.
Wheat for September delivery climbed 9.75 cents to \$5.59 a bushel, while September corn jumped 9 cents to \$3.8425 a bushel and oats for July delivery rose 7.75 cents to \$2.5425 a bushel. November soybeans gained 7.5 cents to \$9.62 a bushel.
Meanwhile, beef and pork futures also traded mostly higher on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange.
August live cattle added 1.37 cents to 92.32 cents a pound; August feeder cattle were flat at \$1.1362 a pound; August lean hogs edged up 2.07 cents to 81.42 cents a pound; and July pork bellies rose 1.55 cents to \$1.0375 a pound.
