"It took me aback that he was procuring a relationship with Ethan Johns," said Leuning.

After an initial meeting with Walls, Leuning and former DCI special agent James Severson said they told Walls he could listen but couldn't question Johns.

"Mouth shut. Ears open," said Severson, the DCI's lead investi-

gator in the Johns case until his retirement last October.

Circuit Judge Steven Jensen said he will rule later on the motion to suppress as well as motions from Johns' attorneys to declare the state's death penalty unconstitutional or to seat two juries — one to consider the evidence and another to decide the death penalty if necessary.

A single jury decides guilt or innocence in death penalty cases and whether the defendant should be executed by lethal injection.

Strange said jurors who can support the death sentence are more prone to vote for conviction, and people morally opposed to capital punishment should not be disqualified from serving on a jury to determine guilt or innocence. Two juries would solve those "twin problems," he said.

Attorney General Marty Jackley argued against both motions. He said the death penalty has been upheld by the state Supreme Court and there's no constitutional or statutory right to have two juries.

Moore. Fingerprints matching his were found in the home.

DNA evidence has also linked Harris-Moore to the June 19 theft of a white 2008 Toyota Sequoia a few miles east of Yankton. That vehicle was later found in Norfolk, Neb.

In those first days after word got out that Harris-Moore was suspected of being in Yankton, Assistant Police Chief Jerry Hisek said he received 15-20 phone calls a day from local, regional and national media. In his 35 years with the police department, he stated that he'd never experienced anything like it. "48 Hours Mystery," "Inside Edition," and "20/20" were among those seeking comments.

"It was kind of hectic," Hisek said. "I don't want to downplay what took place here, but it was because of who he was."

Three calls were received from regional and national media outlets Wednesday seeking comment now that Harris-Moore had made his first U.S. court appearance.

The stream of calls has been slowing down, but Carlson said he expects sporadic interest in Yankton to continue for some time.

"I'm sure something else will pop up," he said. "With a case like this, people want to write books and make a movie. I've already been contacted via e-mail about some of those items. It's not over by a long shot. I hope it is for a while, though."

Carlson and Hisek both said they are glad Harris-Moore was caught.

"I had someone in the media ask me, 'Don't you begrudgingly admire him for how he's gotten away?'" Hisek recalled. "I said, 'No, not at all. Why would I admire a criminal?' It's almost like they've turned him into a folk hero, but he's a criminal. I'm sure it was an interesting two years (on the run from law enforcement) for him, but I look at all the people he's affected. It was only a matter of time before somebody got hurt or worse."

All the media exposure doesn't seem to be bringing a flood of visitors to Yankton, according to Yankton Convention and Visitors Bureau Director Lisa Scheve. She is not aware of anyone making inquiries to her office and citing Harris-Moore as a reason for their interest.

"We may have received a little bit of brand recognition," Scheve said. "People may have seen the name 'Yankton' and thought, 'We used to go camping there.' It's more of the familiarity factor than, 'Let's go to this community because that's where the Barefoot Bandit was.'"

And don't expect any tourism campaigns along the lines of "Follow in the Footsteps of the Barefoot Bandit," she said.

"In this case, a family is having a really hard time dealing with the fact that someone broke into their house, so I don't think it is something Yankton is going to publicize. We want to promote this as a safe community," Scheve stated. "I think the only criminal I'm going to be promoting is (Old West outlaw) Jack McCall."

In fact, the South Dakota SNAP program has actually become more efficient. In 2004, South Dakota had an error rate of 1.97 percent, still well below the national average of 5.88 percent.

Because of the SNAP program's efficiency, South Dakota will receive a total of \$550,198 to assist in the program's funding.

"The money will go into the program with what we already receive," Curry said. "Any amount we get on top of what we already get is beneficial."

Nebraska is also well below the national average in payment errors. In 2009, Nebraska was the fifth best state with a payment error of just 1.54 percent.

Nebraska has seen a considerable improvement in its payment
