CHICAGO (AP) — Grains futures climbed Thursday on the Chicago Board of Trade.

Wheat for September delivery surged 37.25 cents to \$5.9625 a bushel, while September corn rose 8.25 cents to \$3.925 a bushel and oats for July delivery jumped 12.5 cents to \$2.965 a bushel. November soybeans soared 26 cents to \$9.88 a bushel.

Meanwhile, beef and pork futures traded mixed on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange.

August live cattle inched up 0.08 cent to 92.4 cents a pound; August feeder cattle lost 0.25 cent to \$1.1337 a pound; August lean hogs fell 0.8 cent to 90.82 cents a pound; and July pork bellies added 0.45 cent to \$1.042 a pound.
