not be used to build state reserves, he said.

Rounds said spending was reduced by not filling some jobs, delaying some equipment purchases and limiting state employee travel to out-of-state meetings.

Sales tax collections, which provide more than half the state's general fund revenue, amounted to \$642.8 million for the year, a drop of 2.4 percent from the previous year.

Overall, general tax receipts were down \$31 million from the prior year.

In the legislative session that ended in March, lawmakers approved spending cuts and one-time transfers of money to balance the budget for the current year, which began July 1.

Rounds said Friday he believes the state will make it through the current year without touching its two reserve funds, which now hold more than \$107 million.

However, the 2011 Legislature will face a big challenge in balancing the budget for the year beginning next July because the state will no longer be getting federal stimulus money, said Rounds, who leaves office at the end of this year.

Spending in Medicaid, the state-federal program that cover health expenses for low-income people, may continue to rise, he said.

Rounds said he hopes state revenues increase as the economy recovers, but he expects any recovery to be slow. He noted that South Dakota's unemployment rate has been dropping gradually, and now is at 4.5 percent, he said.

"We're hoping we've seen the bottom of the recession. We hope to see a very gradual increase in economic activity," the governor said.

Dilges said he's more optimistic about revenue growth than he was a few months ago, but he said some national economists are worried about another economic downturn and that economic growth is likely to slow with the end of spending from the stimulus program.

Spring flooding may hurt South Dakota's agricultural income, but the economy appears to be benefiting from a drop in unemployment and a growth in business spending, Dilges said.

the Press & Dakotan during a 1995 interview. "They asked for volunteers on a mission that would be vital to the war effort. But we weren't told at the time it would be a Tokyo raid."

Flying at a low altitude, the planes dropped bombs on dozens of targets around five Japanese cities. The American pilots then flew to China, where they landed in the water off the coast or bailed before their planes crashed. One of the planes was landed in the Soviet Union.

Every member of the raiding party made it to the ground safely. However, eight were captured by the Japanese. Of those eight, three were executed, one died in prison and the remaining four were released once World War II ended.

The bombing raid stunned the Japanese and boosted the morale of Americans four months after Pearl Harbor. Potter told the *Minneapolis Star Tribune* in 1990, "I don't think we exhibited any more courage than anyone else. I don't think any of us thought about anything other than that we were doing our jobs."

Potter would receive the Distinguished Flying Cross and Air Medal with three oak leaf clusters before retiring from the Air Force in 1970. He lived in Austin, Texas, until he died May 27, 2002, at age 83.

Rasmussen said Potter came home in an unexpected way after the Doolittle Raid. Rasmussen and another Yankton College alum were at a movie in Sioux Falls.

"That's when they had news reels," he said. "All of a sudden, they showed (wife of Chinese leader Chiang Kai-shek) Madame Chiang shaking hands with Henry Potter. Here was this South Dakota boy being greeted by the wife of the head of China.

"(My friend) Cliff was tall and normally quite quiet," Rasmussen continued. "When he saw that, he stood up in the theatre and said, 'By God, it's Henry Potter!' You could hear him all over the theatre."

They had both known of Potter's accomplishments, but it was a surprise to see him at the movies, he said. "Henry came home that way on the screen," Rasmussen stated. "It was a big moment, because it was a big moment in military history."

After Potter left Yankton College in 1938, Rasmussen said he only saw him in person once more during his lifetime. It was at a reunion held in Rapid City during 1941.

He doesn't exactly know why, after all these years, memories of Potter still stir in his mind. "I guess it's because I wanted to have more time with him," Rasmussen said. "I always felt proud to have been associated with him. Even if he hadn't done what he did, he was a good friend and highly respected among his cohorts. You don't get a chance to know a person as well as you'd like in two years."

Many other people from across the country will be in Yankton this weekend sharing their personal memories of Yankton College, as well, according to Yankton College Executive Director Jan Garrity.

"The bar for excellence was set pretty high at the college," she said. "People went away and had very successful careers as a result of that education."

"You hear these stories of people who were lost souls, but when they got on campus they found a group of people that they never imagined," Garrity continued. "They became great friends and those bonds remain."

Those sentiments are backed up by Rasmussen. "Yankton College is deep in our hearts," he said. "We can't describe it. We are grateful to the fine staff and professors we had. It was a remarkable institution."
