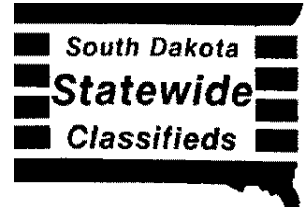

Biden To Pay \$219K To U.S. Treasury

WASHINGTON (AP) — Election watchdogs have directed Joe Biden's 2008 presidential campaign to pay the U.S. Treasury more than \$219,000 to resolve issues caused by sloppy book-keeping and accepting excessive contributions, including a discounted flight on a private jet.

The audit was released Friday by the Federal Election Commission. It determined that the Biden campaign accepted an improper corporate contribution in the form of a round-trip flight between New Hampshire and Iowa in June 2007 for three people. The Biden campaign paid GEH Air Transportation \$7,911 for the first-

class airfare, but regulators say the campaign should have paid the charter rate of \$34,800.

The FEC also found that the Biden campaign could not document repaying at least \$106,000 in donations that were over the limit, and the campaign was ordered to pay the U.S. Treasury more than \$85,000 for stale-dated checks.

The Biden campaign also failed to disclose more than \$3.7 million in payments and roughly \$870,000 in debts.

The audit was conducted in part as a condition of Biden's accepting taxpayer funds for his campaign through the presidential public financing system.

Biden, now the vice president, campaigned for president for nearly a year before dropping out in January 2008 after a poor showing in the Iowa caucuses.

Elizabeth Alexander, a spokeswoman for Biden in the vice president's office, on Saturday said the campaign would repay the money.

"Some repayment is commonplace after presidential campaign audits and the repayment ordered here is relatively small. Payment is due to the Treasury 30 days after the FEC issues its formal ruling and Biden for President will comply with that," she said Saturday.

"California is 9.1 percent," he said. "California is the poster child for mismanagement of state government, and our record is almost identical to theirs. If you think South Dakota is being well-run, or that it's being run by fiscal conservatives, the truth is actually contrary."

Daugaard said Time magazine "is not an expert on finance. The writers for Time magazine? Come on. Moody's, one of the most respected credit analysts in the world, upgraded South Dakota's bond rating. Upgraded it in this economy. Tell me that's not an indicator."

He also said the state's unemployment rate is the second lowest in the nation, and that it's budget is balanced.

The candidates also disagreed when it came to the matter of state employees. Heidepriem said that since Gov. Mike Rounds took office in 2003, the number of state employees has gone from 12,900 to 14,465, while the state's population has remained relatively stable.

"We really shouldn't have increased the size of government like that," he said. "The size and scope of government needs to be brought under control. If we do that, that will free up the dollars necessary to pay state workers a decent wage."

Daugaard said these numbers were incorrect, that in 2003 there were 13,907 employees, and there will be

14,362 for fiscal year 2011.

"That growth is 1,252 in eight years, that's a 1.1 percent increase," Daugaard said. "Sixty-five percent of those employees are teachers, researchers and grad assistants at our state universities. I would be opposed to that."

Seventy-four percent of these positions are paid for "without touching the general fund," the lieutenant governor added.

Heidepriem pointed out that the legislators tried to increase salary policy 1.5 percent on behalf of state employees, but the money was not available "because our budget is wrecked."

For his part, Daugaard said he disagreed with the recent \$10,000 raise granted to Human Services Center director Cory Nelson.

"That was the wrong thing to do," he said. "I regret that we are not able to give raises to our state employees when we're faced with the budget situation we have, but most of those state employees were able to keep their jobs."

One of the other issues the candidates discussed was that of wind energy.

Daugaard said that when he and Rounds took office, the state had three megawatts of installed wind power.

"By the end of last year we were at more than 400 megawatts," he said. "By the end of this year, we'll have more than 600 megawatts. To put that in some perspective, the average demand in South Dakota is 2,000

megawatts. So that means 600 (megawatts) — assuming all turbines are turning at capacity — (is) a pretty healthy percentage."

Heidepriem said that while these figures are accurate, "we are still dwarfed by Minnesota and Iowa. We are not even in the ballpark of those two states, and we have superior quality of wind. We have a much better opportunity than Iowa and Minnesota, but we're asleep at the switch."

Daugaard said the numbers in the other states are higher because it's been mandated by their respective legislatures that a certain percentage of power is provided by renewable resources.

"That's a good policy if you like mandates," he said. "The problem is, it drives wind energy into areas where it would not otherwise be and have it be feasible. It makes those projects more expensive. That expense has to go somewhere. Where does it go? It goes to the rate-payer. So you see electricity rising at more rapid rates in some of these other states than it does in South Dakota."

Heidepriem said the issue "isn't mandates," but incentives provided by the state.

During the past legislative session, he said, both the House and Senate passed a bill that would create incentives for wind power, which was then vetoed by the governor. The veto was eventually overridden.

"If you're serious about promoting wind energy, (creating incentives) is one of the first steps you take, whether there's a mandate or there isn't," Heidepriem said.
