CHICAGO BOARD OF TRADE

CHICAGO (AP) — Grains futures fell Monday on the Chicago Board of Trade.

Wheat for September delivery lost 5 cents to \$5.8225 a bushel, while September corn dropped 13.25 cents to \$3.815 a bushel and oats for September delivery slid 7 cents to \$2.605 a bushel. November soybeans sank 13 cents to \$9.72 a bushel.

Meanwhile, beef futures advanced and pork futures traded mixed on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange.

August live cattle edged up 0.85 cent to 93.12 cents a pound; August feeder cattle rose 1.32 cents to \$1.1442 a pound; August lean hogs slipped 0.08 cent to 81.62 cents a pound; and August pork bellies gained 0.2 cent to 97.7 cents a pound.

Bietz called him immediately after the election results were finalized to set up training for the job.

"I had no idea that was something they would do, but in (Gertsema's) time in the position, he found it was better to start right away," Fitzgerald said. "They've gone through how the budget works. Jason Bietz has gone through how all the funding works with each of the different funds. We have gone through all the grants. We have had meetings on policy and procedure. I would venture to guess we've met 6-7 times for a couple hours each time."

Fitzgerald said that he sees several challenges ahead, but at the same time, he knows the district is in good hands.

"There are some challenges certainly — administratively getting back out of the track system and into the new system will be a bit of a process but not anything entirely new," Fitzgerald said. "Another of the challenges is going to be some of the budget issues facing the Yankton School Board. There will be some tough decisions to make in determining what direction to go if the state decides to continue not funding it appropriately. It is getting tougher. I also believe we have to keep pressure on our local legislators, and if you have an opinion about education, we have to voice that opinion to them in order to keep them abreast of what people want."

That said, Fitzgerald stressed

that the role of a school board member is not to try to micro-manage the district.

"I would say that one of our roles is being an advocate for education and for Yankton Schools," he said. "I think that is important, but we also have to remember what our duties are as board members, and they are to develop policy and procedures and to make sure you have the correct people in the right positions to implement those policies and procedures."

Fitzgerald said he doesn't come to the board with a personal agenda and is not dissatisfied with anything going on with the school or school board right now. He feels when issues and topics come up needing to be addressed, he will be able to do so appropriately for the citizens of Yankton.

Fitzgerald added that community members have already approached him with educational concerns.

"Understanding the funding of the school district and how all the different funds work, and then communicating that to public, is a very difficult thing to do," he said. "It is very important that our board be able to communicate why and what decisions are being made. I am a firm believer that our educational process is going to reflect on our community and that it is truly economic development. So everyone needs to have a stake or share in that process."

Fitzgerald said he is excited to join the Yankton School Board.

"I look forward to starting this process, getting all the information and getting involved," he said.
