## Senate Rejects \$3B Indian Trust Settlement

HELENA, Mont. (AP) — The U.S. Senate has rejected a \$3.4 billion government settlement with American Indians that had been added to a much larger war-funding bill.

The Senate passed the almost \$60 billion bill funding President Obama's troop surge in Afghanistan late Wednesday — but not before stripping out the settlement and \$20 billion in other domestic spending approved by the House.

The Senate's approval would have given the Obama administration the authority to settle a class-action lawsuit filed in 1996 by Elouise Cobell of Browning, Mont. Between 300,000 and 500,000 Native Americans claim the Interior Department mismanaged billions of dollars held in trust by the government.

The House attached the settlement to the war-funding bill earlier this month.

Thursday's vote marks the second time the settlement has failed to pass the Senate. It was originally included in the Democrats' jobs-agenda bill that was caught in a filibuster last month.

### GRAINS FUTURES TRADE MIXED

CHICAGO (AP) — Wheat for September delivery jumped 8.25 cents to \$5.965 a bushel, while September corn lost 3.25 cents to \$3.765 a bushel and oats for September delivery fell 2.5 cents to \$2.55 a bushel. November soybeans were unchanged at \$9.905 a bushel. Meanwhile, beef futures traded mixed and pork futures advanced on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange. August live cattle slipped 0.18 cent to 93.32 cents a pound; August feeder cattle added 0.25 cent to \$1.149 a pound; August lean hogs rose 1.12 cents to 82.62 cents a pound; and August pork bellies edged up 0.45 cent to \$1.01 a pound.

that was on.

"The contractors were able to clean everything up and keep us on schedule," Pearson said. "Fortunately, (the fire) was discovered right away by the landscaping crew. They heard the alarms go off, looked in the window, saw the fire and called the fire department."

Most of the damage was caused by smoke. Ceiling tiles were replaced and areas had to be re-painted.

Development for the Disabled, Inc. (DDI), a nonprofit designated by the South Dakota Housing Development Authority as a Community Housing Development Organization, was the developer for the project.

"Generally, nonprofits come to us with a vision of some type and we put the deal together," said Bill Podhradsky, a development specialist for DDI. "We bring together the architect, the general contractor and the financing."

The organization is also assisting with the redevelopment of the Sir Charles Apartments in Yankton and was involved with Cedar Village.

"I think (the ABS facility) is going to be a great addition to the community support program here," Podhradsky said. "People who live here will have a measure of privacy in their own apartments, but yet they've got support, too."

Lloyd Companies was the general contractor for the facility.

"It's very rewarding to work with the nonprofits," said Roger Mack, a broker associate with the company. "We're very happy to be a part of the project."
