Red Green To Visit Yankton Bomgaars Aug. 1

Red Green, star of the long-running public television comedy series, will be at Bomgaars in Yankton, Sunday, Aug. 1, from 2-4 p.m. The public is invited to the free autograph and photo opportunity.

The event is sponsored by Bomgaars, 3M and the Friends of South Dakota Public Broadcasting. Later on Sunday, Red Green's "Wit and Wisdom Tour" live show will take place in Sioux Falls. The show, at 8 p.m. in the historic Orpheum Theater, is sold out.

Red Green, played by Steve Smith, is the creator of and lead character in "The Red Green Show," which centers around some very peculiar characters who live somewhere up north in the small community of Possum Lake. The men celebrate their bonds as members of the Possum Lodge, create dubious inventions, and run afoul of modern life over the course of 300 episodes.

The show generated 15 seasons, 300 episodes, several specials, a weekly syndicated newspaper column, three books, and a feature film, "Duct Tape Forever." Seen on more than 80 PBS stations, including South Dakota Public Broadcasting, "The Red Green Show" is the longest running Canadian television series in the U.S. of all time, and is the second longest running television comedy series ever. The show was taken to the MIR Space Station and was a question on "Jeopardy."

Smith has won three Gemini Awards (Canadian equivalent of an Emmy), including the Earle Grey Lifetime Achievement Award. In 2006, Smith became a Member of the Order of Canada, which is the highest civilian honor the Canadian government can bestow. His latest book, "We're All In This Together," was released in Canada last November and is already a Canadian bestseller. Smith currently is writing his next book, "How To Do Everything (From the Man Who Should Know)," which will be released by Random House Publishing this fall.

meant to help the districts in the basin finance measures, such as buying water from farmers, to send Kansas the water it is owed in future years under the

Republican River compact. But early last year, the Nebraska Supreme Court ruled that the additional property taxing authority was primarily for state, not local, purposes and was therefore unconstitutional.

Still standing is a per-acre tax on irrigated land also authorized in the 2007 law. In March, a Lancaster County District Court judge has upheld that tax. The

Wind Tower Plant Plans On Hold

BRANDON (AP) — A new plant in Brandon has delayed the start of operations because of too few contracts for wind towers.

John Segvich, a spokesman for Tower Tech System's parent company, Broadwind Energy, says once enough contracts are secured, the 115,000-square-foot plant will become operational.

He says the equipment is in place, but workers have not yet been hired. The plant is expected to employ about 150.

The Brandon wind plant will create large towers that support wind turbine blades. It will have the capacity to manufacture 150 of the three-section towers each year.
