• Prospects of a large grain crop to be marketed in this section this year has resulted in the reopening of the DeCamp Elevator, which has been closed since last September, and for the past several years has been open primarily for supplying food and coal to customers.  
• No progress has been made in the ongoing labor dispute at John Morrell and Company, with an additional picket striking up at a local market carrying Morrell's products. Approximately 570 men, including foremen, are inside the plant, less than half the number working when the strike was called.

**50 YEARS AGO**  
**Wednesday, July 27, 1960**  
• The 14 votes of South Dakota's delegation were all but in the pocket of Vice President Richard M. Nixon

today as the hour for presidential balloting drew near at this Republican National Convention.  
• A \$60,000 bond issue by the city of Wagner for construction of a National Guard armory was approved in a city election Tuesday by a vote of 383 to 109.

**CHICAGO (AP) —** Grains futures traded lower Monday on the Chicago Board of Trade.  
Wheat for September delivery dropped 67 cents to \$5.895 a bushel, while September corn slid 7.25 cents to \$3.64 a bushel and oats for September delivery fell 3.75 cents to \$2.51 a bushel. November soybeans sank 15.5 cents to \$9.66 a bushel.  
Meanwhile, beef and pork futures also fell on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange.  
October live cattle lost 0.95 cent to 93.77 cents a pound; August feeder cattle slipped 0.25 cent to \$1.1492 a pound; October lean hogs shed 1.52 cents to 75.5 cents a pound; and August pork bellies edged down 0.75 cent to \$1.0275 a pound.
