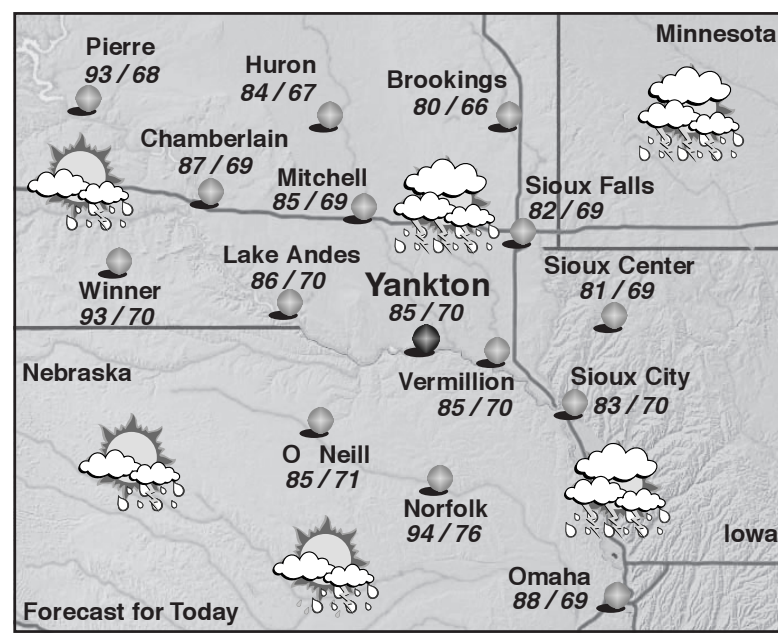

office will have to prove the same elements necessary for an arson conviction in adult court. The maximum sentence for a child that is found to be a delinquent is commitment to the South Dakota Department of Corrections, which would then decide at which of its institutions the juvenile would be placed and for how long. A juvenile can be kept in the correc-

tions system until the age of 21. Other possible penalties are a fine and revocation of a driver's license. The investigation into the fire was conducted by the Yankton Police Department, the Yankton Fire Department, the South Dakota State Fire Marshal, the federal Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives, and the Yankton County State's Attorney Office. The damage done to St. John's, which is located at 1009 Jackson Street, was placed at more than \$2 million. It has since been rebuilt and is in use by the congregation.

CHICAGO BOARD OF TRADE
 CHICAGO (AP) — Grains futures advanced Wednesday on the Chicago Board of Trade.
 Wheat for September delivery soared 20.5 cents to \$6.155 a bushel, while September corn jumped 13.5 cents to \$3.7625 a bushel and oats for September delivery climbed 10.5 cents to \$2.57 a bushel. November soybeans rose

12.5 cents to \$9.78 a bushel. Meanwhile, beef futures traded mixed and pork futures rose on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange.
 October live cattle edged up 0.25 cent to 94.17 cents a pound; August feeder cattle lost 0.38 cent to \$1.1452 a pound; October lean hogs added 0.7 cent to 76.92 cents a pound; and August pork bellies gained 3 cents to \$1.0275 a pound.
