The first day of school for Grades 1-12 is Thursday, August 19, for a full day. Special Education Preschool, Junior Kindergarten, Kindergarten, and Transition 1 classes will begin on Friday, August 20. Webster Elementary Preschool will begin the week of August 23. YANKTON HIGH SCHOOL STUDENT INFORMATION

New high school students who were not enrolled in Yankton School District during the 2009-10 school year should report to the Counseling Office to register between 8:30 a.m. and 3:30 p.m. on August 3, 4, or 5. A parent or guardian should accompany them. **All new students must present a certified copy of their birth certificate.** Prior to registration, parents are asked to request student records from the previous school attended. If these dates are not convenient, please contact the high school Counseling Office (665-7378) during the week of August 2-6 for an appointment.

9th Grade Orientation – The 9th grade orientation will be held on Tuesday, August 10, beginning at 7:00 p.m. sharp. Student council members and staff will be available to assist students at 6:45 p.m. However, all students need to be in their homerooms no later than 7:00 p.m. A presentation for 9th grade parents will be held in the YHS Theatre beginning promptly at 7:00 pm. The orientation will conclude at 7:45 pm.

Parents of 9th grade students should pay student fees from 8:00 a.m. - 4:00 p.m. at the YHS Principal's Office on Tuesday, August 10. If this specific date doesn't work, the office is open the entire week of August 9-13 from 8:00 a.m. - 4:00 p.m.

Parents of students in grades 10, 11, and 12 should pay student fees anytime from 8:00 a.m. - 4:00 p.m. the entire week of August 9-13 at the YHS Principal's office.

Student schedules and a letter pertaining to other school information for grades 9-12 will be sent out prior to the week of August 9-13.

School meal deposits can be made and student activity tickets (\$25.00) will be sold during registration. Please use separate checks for meal deposits and student activity tickets.

MIDDLE SCHOOL STUDENT REGISTRATION

New Middle School students who were not enrolled in Yankton School District during the 2009-2010 school year should report to the Counseling Office to register between 9:00 a.m. and 11:00 a.m. on Thursday, August 5. If this date is not convenient, please contact the Middle School for an appointment. **All new students must present a certified copy of their birth certificate.**

All students should report on the following days to pick up schedules and teacher assignments. Packets may be picked up during or after the scheduled times. If you are not able to register, please call the principal's office at 665-2419.

Grade 6.....Monday, August 9, 9:00-11:00 a.m.

Grade 7.....Tuesday, August 10, 9:00-11:00 a.m.

Grade 8.....Tuesday, August 10, 12:00-2:00 p.m.

You may make *LunchBox* deposits at any time and in any amount based on \$1.15 per breakfast, \$1.90 per meal and .30 per milk. For information regarding the Automatic Draft payment option, contact the food service director at 665-8379 or visit the "School Lunch Program" Quick Link on the district website: <http://www.ykd.k12.sd.us> (If you wish to make electronic deposits, both new and past participants must fill out the Direct Debit form for the 2010-2011 school year.) School meal deposits can be made and student activity tickets (\$22.00) will be sold during registration. Please use separate checks for meal deposits and student activity tickets. The 6th Grade Open House will be held on Tuesday, August 17 (Free Cook-out, 5:30-6:00 p.m./Open House 6:00-7:00 p.m.). The 7th/8th Grade Open House will be held on Monday, August 30 (6:30-7:30 p.m.).

ELEMENTARY SCHOOL REGISTRATION

Elementary school students who attended Yankton Public Schools during 2009-2010 **DO NOT** report until opening day, August 19. **NEW** students should register August 3 or 4 from 9:00 a.m. to noon at their respective school building. Parents of Junior Kindergarten, Kindergarten, and 1st Grade students who have not pre-registered should register at their respective school buildings on the above registration days. If unsure of student placement, contact the superintendent's office at 665-3998. **All new students must present a certified copy of their birth certificate.** Parents of children who will be five years old by September 1, 2010, but who will not be attending Kindergarten may register for Junior Kindergarten at Webster School if they have not already done so. Call 665-2484 after July 30.

Parent-Teacher orientation conferences will be held on Thursday, August 19, for all parents of incoming Junior Kindergarten and Kindergarten children. If you do not receive notice of your scheduled time by August 13, contact the principal. The first day of school for early intervention, Junior Kindergarten and Kindergarten classes is Friday, August 20th. Preschool orientation meetings will be held Thursday, August 19, August 20, and Monday, August 23. The first day of Preschool will be August 24th.

During the school year, parents may make *LunchBox* deposits at any time during the school year and any amount based upon \$1.15 per breakfast, \$1.70 per lunch and .30 per milk. However, please make your first *LunchBox* deposit after August 4, but prior to the first day of school. For information regarding the Automatic Draft payment option, contact the food service director at 665-8379 or visit the "School Lunch Program" Quick Link on the district website: <http://www.ykd.k12.sd.us> (If you wish to make electronic deposits, both new and past participants must fill out the Direct Debit form for the 2010-2011 school year.) Student activity tickets will be available for \$22.00 each. Please use separate checks for meal deposits and student activity tickets.

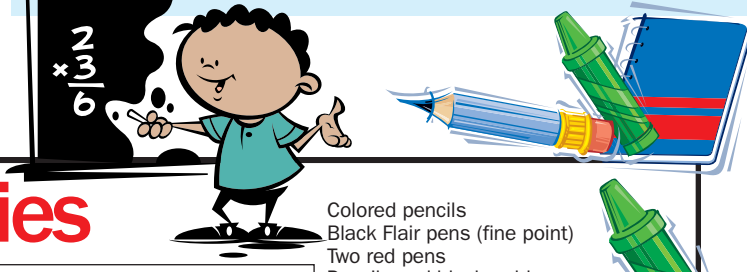
