raw water intakes that the plant uses. "When water comes into the power plant, it goes through filters to strain out the debris, and they have had a significant amount of debris come through," he said. "Our water intakes to the power plant are so plugged up that we do not have enough raw water for heating and cooling to run three units anyway. We can only get enough of that water in to run two units."

To combat the debris, Becker said the Corps has concentrated on three main areas.

"The first one is the removal of the floating debris in front of the power plant," he said. "They have a crane on a barge that they push out there with a tugboat. They've been getting that material out of the lake and then taking it to the north end of the spillway."

The Corps has also placed emphasis on catching the debris before it even reaches the power plant.

"We've had people out there in Jon boats gathering logs and trees and pulling them up on shore with tractors and so forth so they wouldn't float down and get into the power plant," Becker said. "We believe they've gotten roughly 500-600 trees and logs off the lake with the Jon boats."

The third area of focus has been on cleaning the water intakes to allow more raw water to enter the power plant for heating and cooling purposes.

"Normally, those are cleaned once every two weeks," Becker said. "They've been cleaning them anywhere from one to two times a day."

Regional Park Supervisor Jeff VanMeeteren said workers at the Lewis and Clark Recreation Area have had their hands full with debris as well.

"It started the week of June 8. We just started getting inundated with logs, cornstalks and cattails on our beaches and boat ramps," he said. "The biggest problem is for our visitors and those that come to the lake is that it just doesn't look real nice. Nobody wants to see a beach full of logs and that kind of stuff. And it's become at some points a daily task just to keep those clean."

Both VanMeeteren and Becker said the debris removal has disrupted other work that is usually done during this time of the year.

"Aside from being an inconvenience, it's just another thing that we didn't anticipate having to do," VanMeeteren said. "So we have to pull crews off of other work, such as cutting down dead trees and painting shelters and structures in the park."

"It's taken away from things we normally do," Becker added. "For the people with the power plant and the parks, it's taken away from some of the routine maintenance items that they do. For some of the biologists, it's keeping them away from some of their work with endangered and threatened species."

While the work has been demanding, there have been signs of better days ahead.

"It has slowed down a little bit," Becker said. VanMeeteren said the size of the debris has changed, as well.

"In the middle of the month, we were pulling out huge logs and trees. Anymore, it's more of the smaller diameter pieces of wood," he said. "So we hope that the worst is past us."
