Each bid must be accompanied by bid security payable to the Owner for ten percent (10%) as a bidder's bond or five (5%) percent of the total amount of the Bid as a certified or bank check issued by a State or National bank. As soon as the bid prices have been compared, the Owner will return the check or bond of all except the three lowest, responsive, responsible bidders for each Schedule. The MBE goal for this project is 1% of the total dollar value of the job while the WBE goal is 4% of the total dollar value of the job.

**NONDISCRIMINATION IN EMPLOYMENT**

a) Bidders on this work will be required to comply with the President's executive orders Nos. 11246 as amended, 11458, 11518, and 11625. The requirements for Bidders and Contractors under these orders are explained in the Specifications.

b) The goal for female utilization which shall be included in all federal and federally assisted construction contracts and subcontracts in excess of \$10,000 shall be 6.9%. The goal for minority utilization which shall be included in all federal and federally assisted construction contracts and subcontracts in excess of \$10,000 shall be 1.2%. The goals are applicable to the Contractor's aggregate on-site construction workforce whether or not part of that workforce is performing work on a federally and federally assisted contract or subcontract.

With submittal of a Bid, the Contractor represents that he has visited the site, familiarized himself with the local conditions under which the work is to be performed, and correlated his observations with the requirements of the Contract Documents.

The Owner reserves the right to reject any and all bids or to accept any bid. It is understood that the work to be done is being financed with funds from U.S. Department of Agriculture, Rural Utilities Service. Contractor's Proposals shall hold firm for thirty (30) days from the date of opening. Mutually agreed upon extensions of time may be made, if necessary.

But a three-judge panel of the 8th U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals reversed her decision in 2004, saying the judge had to hold further proceedings to determine if the South Dakota laws were unconstitutional.

Planned Parenthood and the state eventually reached a compromise, agreeing that the limit would be interpreted as 14 weeks and six days following the beginning of a woman's last menstrual period.

In 2005, the South Dakota Legislature passed a bill requiring doctors to tell women that abortions end human lives and may later cause serious psychological problems for women who have them. The bill, signed into law by Gov. Mike Rounds, stipulated that a woman also would have to be told she has a legal relationship with her unborn child and that the relationship would be terminated by an abortion.

Planned Parenthood sued, arguing that doctors should not be forced to become mouthpieces for state abortion ideology.

A day before the law was scheduled to take effect, Schreier issued an order preventing the state from enforcing it while the lawsuit proceeds.

"The South Dakota statute requires abortion doctors to enunciate the State's viewpoint on an unsettled medical, philosophical, theological, and scientific issue, that is, whether a fetus is a human being," Schreier wrote in her preliminary order.

Her decision was affirmed by a

three-judge appeals panel, but the full 11-member 8th Circuit later ruled that South Dakota could begin enforcing the law and sent the case back to Schreier.

In 2009, Schreier upheld the part of the law that requires women to be told abortion ends a human life, but struck down disclosures that the procedure increases the likelihood of suicide and that they have an existing relationship with the fetus.

The state, Alpha Center and another pregnancy counseling center appealed the ruling, and the law remains tied up in court.

Supporters of the 2011 measure say the Planned Parenthood clinic in Sioux Falls gives women little information or counseling before they have abortions done by doctors flown in from out of state. They say the bill would help make sure women are not being coerced into abortions by boyfriends or relatives.

Alpha Center was a party to the 2005 case, and the organization is petitioning to intervene in 2011 case, Unruh said.

But for now, the battle is between Planned Parenthood and the state of South Dakota, and officials have not yet decided how to proceed.

Attorney General Marty Jackley said after the ruling that its options were to appeal the preliminary injunction, continue to argue the merits of the case, discuss a potential settlement or do nothing. Jackley said he was having discussions with attorneys, the governor and legislative leaders before deciding the state's next step.

South Dakota's latest restriction says abortions can only be scheduled

by a doctor who has personally met with a woman and determined she is voluntarily seeking an abortion. The procedure can't be done until at least 72 hours after that first consultation, establishing the longest waiting period in the nation.

Before getting an abortion, a woman also will have to consult with a pregnancy help center to get information about services available to help her give birth and keep a child. The state will publish a list of pregnancy help centers, all of which seek to persuade women to give birth.

Schreier did let stand a small part of the law allowing pregnancy help centers to register with the state, but she suspended all the sections that require women to consult with those centers.

Planned Parenthood contends that voters have twice sent the message that the government should stay out of the issue, but legislators and the governor continue to push the issue.

Voters rejected statewide ballot measures in 2006 and 2008 that would have banned most abortions in the state, measures that sought to provoke a court challenge of Roe v. Wade.

Sarah Stoesz, president and chief executive of Planned Parenthood Minnesota, North Dakota, South Dakota, said state officials need to stop being bullied by abortion opponents and start listening to voters.

"This is a complete waste of money and time for the state," Stoesz said.

About half the states, including South Dakota, now have 24-hour waiting periods. No other state requires women to visit pregnancy crisis centers before getting abortions.

**Secret Service To Probe Twitter Hack**

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Secret Service said Monday it will investigate the hacking of Fox's political Twitter account over updates claiming that President Barack Obama had been assassinated.

Secret Service spokesman George Ogilvie says the law enforcement agency whose job it is to protect the president will conduct a probe of the false postings and that "we will conduct the appropriate follow up."


Hackers broke into the FoxNewsPolitics account early Monday, leaving a series of six tweets reporting that Obama had been shot to death in Iowa and the shooter was unknown.

In a statement posted on its website, Fox News called the tweets "malicious" and "false."

"We will be requesting a detailed investigation from Twitter about how this occurred, and measures to prevent future unauthorized access into FoxNews.com accounts," said Jeff Misenti, vice president and general manager of Fox News Digital.

An online magazine at New York's Stony Brook University, Think, reported that initial posts around midnight indicated the Fox News Twitter account had been hacked by a group called the Script Kiddies. Harmless posts announcing the group's hacking of the Fox News account were followed by the false posts about Obama, according to Think.

A Think staffer, Adam Peck, wrote on the magazine's website that he had exchanged electronic messages with a person claiming to be with the Script Kiddies shortly after the initial hacking. Later, however, the unidentified person would not confirm that the group was behind the Obama posts, Peck wrote.
