NEW YORK (AP) — Alex Rodriguez's sore right knee will keep him out of the All-Star game and the Yankees' lineup.

Rodriguez pulled out of Tuesday's game in Arizona after he was held out of the lineup against the Tampa Bay Rays before it was postponed by rain on Friday night.

He was sent for an MRI that manager Joe Girardi said was precautionary but he wasn't sure if Rodriguez will be able to play Saturday afternoon against the Rays.

Rodriguez had been reluctant to ask out of a game since being injured, especially when Derek Jeter was on the disabled list. But he has looked considerably slower on the basepaths recently.

"He's not moving well," Girardi said. "His leg has been a little sore."

Rodriguez tweaked the knee against the Cubs at Wrigley Field on June 19. Despite hitting .359 with 10 RBIs in his last 16 games, Rodriguez has not homered in 85 at-bats, the

longest single-season drought of his career, and Girardi said the knee could be hindering A-Rod's play long enough for he swings, and thus his power.

Rodriguez has 13 homers this season and 626 for his career. He hasn't connected since June 11 though he hit a drive high off the wall in center field at Citi Field a week ago, more than 400 feet from home plate. After that game he said, "I have no pop," while walking out of the Yankees clubhouse.

Former Iowa Wrestler Selected For SDSU Coaching Staff

BROOKINGS — South Dakota State Director of Athletics Justin Sell and head wrestling coach Jason Liles announced Friday the hiring of former Iowa Lakes Community College head coach and University of Iowa wrestler Ty Eustice as assistant coach for the Jackrabbit wrestling program.

"I am extremely excited to have Ty as our first full-time assistant wrestling coach at South Dakota State," Liles said. "He has had excellent mentors during his career and his pedigree of success both as an athlete and as a collegiate coach is exceptional. Ty is a perfect fit for SDSU and there's no question that he will impact our program."

A Blue Earth, Minn., native, Eustice has experience at every level of NCAA wrestling, competing at Division I and coaching at Division II and Division III.

"I'm very excited to get back to the Division I level and work with guys who are passionate about the sport, and who are willing to make the sacrifices necessary to become successful," Eustice said. "SDSU is a school that is thriving and growing. The Jackrabbits have a great tradition and are dedicated to excelling at the highest of levels."

Eustice spent the last two seasons as the head coach at Iowa Lakes. He became one of the nation's youngest head coaches when he was hired in July 2009. In his time at ILCC, Eustice led the Lakers to a 14-11 dual meet

record and two top-10 national tournament places. ILCC qualified 17 wrestlers for nationals during his tenure, including a two-time national champion, six All-Americans and two Academic All-Americans.

Prior to his time at Iowa Lakes, Eustice served as assistant wrestling coach at Cornell College, a Division III institution in Mount Vernon, Iowa. In his lone season there, Rams finished eighth at the NCAA Championships and had three All-Americans.

Before Cornell, Eustice spent two years at Division II Minnesota State University, Mankato as a graduate assistant. In his time at MSU, Eustice earned a Master of Arts degree in sports management while helping the Mavericks secure two top-five team finishes, two individual national champions, and 12 All-Americans.

Eustice was a four-year letterwinner at the University of Iowa from 2001-06. After redshirting as a freshman, Eustice compiled a 111-29 collegiate record, including a 28-3 mark his senior season. He received all-American recognition his junior and senior years, placing fifth and second at the NCAA Championships, respectively. Eustice received the team Mike Howard Most Valuable Wrestler his senior year and the team Mike McGivern Most Courageous Wrestler Award his redshirt freshman year. He was a two-time team captain, four-time NCAA Division I National Qualifier and a Cadet, Junior and FILA Junior National Freestyle All-American. Eustice graduated in 2006 with a bachelor's degree in art.

In his prep days at Blue Earth High School, Eustice won four individual state titles.

Dakota Blue Devils Off To Fast Start In Florida

ORLANDO, Fla. — With a trio of area standouts leading the way, the Dakota Blue Devils' 11th-grade girls' basketball team went 2-0 Friday on the first day at the AAU Super Showcase tournament in Orlando, Fla.

Competing in the Silver division, the Blue Devils defeated Alabama Elite 58-43 in an early morning game and later beat Arkansas Mavericks 67-55.

Among the players on the 17-Under roster are Beresford's Alison Klostergaard, Wagner's Devon Brecke and Parkston's Marie Malloy.

The Blue Devils will face Tampa Bay Inferno at 8:50 a.m. CDT today (Saturday) for first place in their pool. The top team in each of the 13 pools advance to the championship round bracket.

Two other Blue Devils teams are also competing at the tournament.

The 15-Under sophomore team started Friday with a 2-0 record, after beating Blue Star Maryland 57-45 and edging Vigilance Blakes 58-54 — after trailing by 15 points with six minutes to play.

Brown Named Asst. Equestrian Coach

BROOKINGS — South Dakota State Director of Athletics Justin Sell, along with head equestrian coach Megan Rossiter, announced the addition of Kamerra Brown to the equestrian staff on Friday as the team's assistant coach.

"We are very excited to add Kamerra as an assistant coach," Rossiter said. "Her enthusiasm, knowledge and expertise of hunt seat competition and the fact that she's already worked at SDSU allows her

to hit the ground running. I look forward to working with her."

Brown joins the Jackrabbits equestrian staff full-time after serving as a graduate assistant for the 2010-11 season working with the hunt seat riders and after a successful riding career at Delaware State University in Dover, Del.

"I am so happy and excited to work for a university where the community and staff gets behind their athletic programs," Brown said, "I also look forward to the opportunity to continue working with the young and talented riders on our team."

A four-year letterwinner and captain at Delaware State, Brown earned team MVP honors following her freshman, sophomore and junior seasons, and won numerous MVP awards at various shows throughout her four years at DSU. In addition to her individual accomplishments, she helped lead the hunt seat team to the Varsity Equestrian National Championships in 2008 and 2009, where she posted wins in equitation over fences.

Before graduating from Delaware State in 2010 with a Bachelor of Science degree in animal and poultry science. Brown added to her athletic resume by competing on the Hornets track team as a junior, where she excelled in sprinting events on the traveling squad.

A Culpeper, Va., native, Brown started riding horses at five years old, and won numerous awards over the years, but she lists her most proud moments as qualifying for the 2003 National Pony Finals in Ohio, and finishing 16th in the country in the Large Green Pony Hunter division. She also won Reserve Champion honors at the 'A' rated Upperville Horse show in the Pony Hunter division and won the Washington International Equitation Medal class, both in 2004. She also earned all-state track and field honors as a sprinter in high school.

An active member in FFA, Brown participated in heart walks and stayed actively involved with student life, volunteering at local elementary schools and in the Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC), including a stint as treasurer from 2006-09 and as president from 2009-10. Brown also topped a list of 1,800 nominees to appear at the 2008 NCAA Leadership Convention in Florida.
