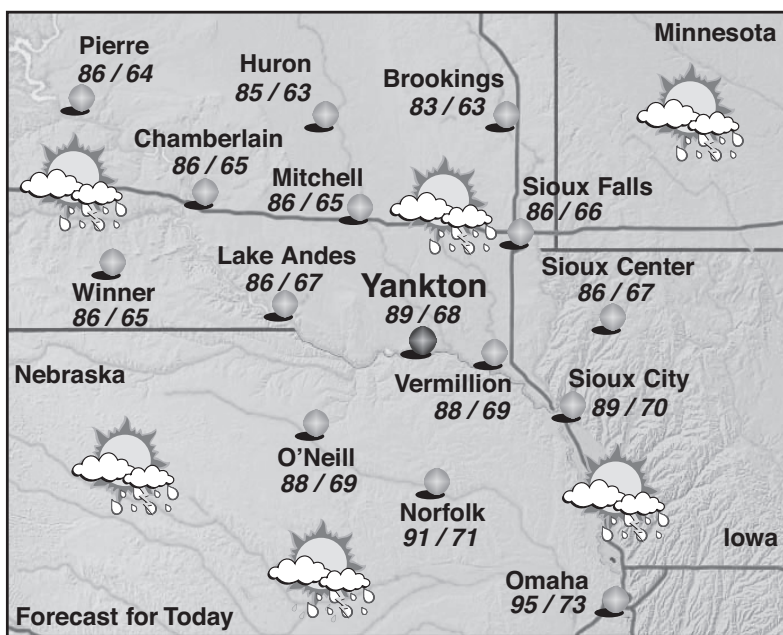

the names of two truck manufacturers — Diamond T and REO — with the latter becoming misspelled in the band's name. Besides Diamond Rio, this year's Cedar County Fair features a wide range of acts for the grandstand. This week's entertainment also features the "Triumphant Sound Quartet" on Wednesday, championship rodeo action on Thursday, the country music group "Trailer Choir" on Friday, "Them Other Dudes" on Saturday and Cummins Stock Car Races on Sunday. The fair offers free admission and also features a carnival midway during the entire fair, along with a hamburger feed on Thursday night and an ice cream social on Sunday, Steinhoff said. Thursday night's rodeo has

added a challenge ride, he said. "Our local Bank of Hartington has put up a donation of \$500 so the person who wins the bull riding can ride another bull," he said. "If he stays on that particular bull for eight seconds, he wins the \$500 bonus." Friday night features the sheep classic at the livestock arena, Steinhoff said. "It's open to the world," he said. "Anyone with market lambs or breeding sheep can enter, and we usually get people from different states." The Cedar County Fair has grown greatly in recent years, Steinhoff said. "Five years ago, we were at a meeting, and we just said, we either got to make it or break it ourselves. We went after and got Josh Gracin," he said. "We had a big rainfall (just before the concert), and he went on anyway. Even without electricity, he gave a great performance." The Cedar County Fair continues to offer an excellent run with

more than 1,700 4-H, open class and FFA exhibits, according to Extension office manager Mary Lou Steffen. "Extension educator Jackie Steffen started doing a few workshops throughout the year. More of those projects are coming in home environment areas, and the number of those exhibits is up," she said. "We also have a lot of new Clover Kids, who are 5 to 7 years old. It's participation only at that age, but they can get Clover Kid ribbons." Brothers Dan Wieseler of Hartington and Gary Wieseler of St. Helena are also working with Bongaar's store in Hartington on

the "Pick A Chick" project, Mary Lou Steffen said. "Gary and Dan led a mini-workshop where you could show your birds and get ready for the fair," she said. "At the beginning of the small animal show, the Clover Kids have their own little chicken show. Reynold Loecker of Yankton is one of the judges." Kelby Sudbeck of Fordyce, a past Cedar County 4-Her who is now a student at University of Nebraska-Lincoln, brings his expertise with livestock judging to the skill-a-thon, Steffen said. Saturday, July 11, 1936
 • J. E. Hipple, editor of the *Pierre Capital Journal*, today advocated a special session of the South Dakota legislature for the purpose of enacting "some sort of a moratorium, time extension, or installment program for payment of personal property taxes. There never was a time in the history of the territory creating the two Dakotas that there was such evidences of distress as there is and will be for months to come."
 • Leslie Jensen of Hot Springs, republican candidate for governor, here on a tour of the state today advocated that the government pay ranchers and farmers cost of production to prevent further distress from the drought and urged that the government waive its lien for any feed loan on such portion of existing livestock herds which the drought sufferer is obliged to sell.

 • When the Yankton Board of Education held its annual reorganization meeting Monday night, Dr. T. H. Willcockson was named president. He succeeds Wally Flint, who retired from the board along with Dr. J. M. Hohn, interim member.

• Oglala Sioux Indians are punching time cards and forming car pools for a new industry that has increased its labor 14-fold. Wright & McGill Co., Denver, opened a fishing equipment assembly plant here (Pine Ridge) in January as an experiment. Use of Indian labor has proven so successful that plans for a more permanent factory building are being made.
25 YEARS AGO
Friday, July 11, 1986
 • Vice President George Bush shook the hand of an employee of the South Dakota National Guard after his plane landed at Joe Foss Field in Sioux Falls. Reelecting James Abdnor is important if Republicans want to retain control of the U.S. Senate and move forward with the administration's domestic goals, Vice President George Bush said at a campaign fund-raiser for Abdnor.
 • First-time homebuyers in South Dakota can get mortgages at 8.85 percent interest under a state loan program approved Thursday. The South Dakota Housing Development Authority Commission made \$72 million available at the lower interest rate by refunding some tax-exempt bonds sold last year and issuing new ones.
