Street Seal Coat Project Under Way In Yankton

The City of Yankton Street Department will begin the street seal coat program the week of July 12 and should be completed in approximately one week, weather permitting.

Streets scheduled for sealing include the following:

- Cedar Street — 19th Street to 21st Street
- Elm Street — Cedar Street to 20th Street
- Walnut Street — 19th Street to 20th Street

- Walnut Street — 23rd Street to 25th Street
- Grandview Circle — Cul-de-sac
- Alley — 8th St. to 9th St./Mulberry Street & Pearl Street
- Alley — 9th St. to 10th St./Pine Street & Mulberry Street
- Alley — 10th St. to 11th St./Pine Street & Mulberry Street
- Alley — 9th St. to 10th St./Douglas Avenue & Pine Street
- 5th Street — Spruce Street to Green Street
- 10th Street — Douglas Avenue to Pine Street
- 11th Street — Mulberry Street to Burleigh Street
- 14th Street — Mulberry Street to Burleigh Street
- Fairway Drive — Cul-de-sac
- Western Avenue — 23rd Street

to Northern Avenue

The process will be to oil the road and cover it with 3/8-inch chips. The streets will be closed to traffic during the seal coat process and opened to traffic immediately after the application. After 4-6 weeks, the street sweeper will pick up the excess chips that are still loose.

"No Parking" signs will be placed on the streets the day before they are sealed. The public should observe these signs and do not park on the streets until the work is done. Do not blow grass onto the street before the streets are sealed or permit underground irrigation systems to run water onto the streets while the No Parking signs are up.

In the event of rain, the process may be postponed.

Woman Dies In Accident Near Santee

SANTEE, Neb. — A Lincoln, Neb., woman has died in a rollover accident near Santee, Neb.

Crystal Canby, 28, was ejected from the 2004 Windstar van during the accident around 6 a.m. Sunday, according to the Nebraska State Patrol.

The accident occurred about

four miles south of Santee on Nebraska Spur 54D.

Sonny Redowl, 24, of Santee was driving southbound and lost control when a wheel dropped off the edge of the roadway, according to authorities. Redowl over-corrected, crossed back across the highway and onto the northbound shoulder. The van then rolled

several times.

Neither the driver nor the passenger was wearing restraints, and Canby was ejected from the van.

Redowl was taken to Avera Sacred Heart Hospital in Yankton.

The Nebraska State Patrol is continuing its investigation into the accident.
