ing the time frame of the tournaments. However, Dennis Berkland, owner of the Colonial Inn, Star-Brite Inn and Star-Lite Inn, said several rooms were still available at his three locations.

Scheve said that persistence will be key for visitors looking for rooms. "If at first you don't succeed, try and try again" is my best suggestion for people," she said. "Start at the top of your list and call every facility that we have here in Yankton to see if you can find a room, because there are some rooms still available in the area. You just might not get your first pick."

While most visitors will seek hotel rooms within the city, Scheve added that these types of scenarios often

call for other options.

"From time to time when we have large tournaments come into the Yankton area, we contact Mount Marty College to see if the availability would be there for us to use one of their dormitories," she said. "That is something we have done during the last couple of summers when we've had some large tournaments come into the area and we've needed some additional places for people to stay."

This year, Mount Marty College is offering special room rates for people attending the archery tournaments. Questions and reservations may be directed to Jessica Sejnoha at the National Field Archery Association office at (605)260-9279, ext. 203, between 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. The deadline for registrations and cancellations is noon, Friday, July 15.

Scheve said it is also sometimes necessary to send visitors to neighboring communities.

"We will be sending some people

to communities around us — Vermillion for example," she said. "It's just one of those situations, and these things happen."

Rooms have been reserved at the Holiday Inn Express in Vermillion for fans attending the baseball tournament and can be obtained by calling (605)624-7600, according to the Yankton Baseball Association's website.

However, the celebration has broadened in recent years to embrace not only the history — such as the ethnic food and Daneville Heritage Museum displays — but also provide activities for all visitors, Hartmann added.

"You don't have to be Danish to enjoy Danish Viking Days," she said. "It's like everyone in town has a birthday at the same time and we're all celebrating it together."

Danish Viking Days has also become a time for celebrating Viborg's achievements and planning for the future, the co-chairs explained.

"This all started up with Viborg's centennial in 1993," Christensen said. "There has just been so much change and growth — a lot of good trends."

One project becomes immediately visible, as Viborg has undertaken water and sewer line construction, Hartmann said. The current work will be finished by Friday afternoon, in time for the celebration's kick-off, she said.

The project will not only upgrade infrastructure but prepare Viborg for next year's work on South Dakota Highway 19, which runs north-south through town, Hartmann explained.

In addition, Lund Theater has resumed operation after closing for a brief time. The movie projector broke down, and townspeople helped raise the \$4,500 needed for a used projector.

"People were holding fundraisers — even the kids were running lemonade stands," Hartmann said.

Area residents didn't want to lose the theater, Christensen said.

"Viborg has a history like that," he said. "They don't want to see anything close. They want to make it work."

Christensen said he was pleasantly surprised to see the response to the theater's return.

"The first week it was open again, I went to the movie and there were 140 people," he said. "It was packed. I didn't know where the people came from."

However, the theater faces more challenges, Christensen said. "Right now, it's a temporary fix. They are looking at \$70,000 to make a digital upgrade (for the video projector) in the next couple of years."

Still, the co-chairs think Viborg is up to the task. The Turner County community of about 800 residents has become a regional retail and health care center, with Farmers Lumber Company symbolizing the regional trade area.

More changes may lie ahead, Hartmann and Christensen said, as the Viborg and Hurley school districts have submitted a consolidation plan to the state. The patrons of both districts will likely vote on the plan later this year.

While not predicting the outcome of a consolidation vote, Hartmann said the sports cooperative has produced great success and has bonded the two towns.

"The kids meld together so well, and in turn the two communities have melded together so well," she said.

For Hartmann, the past year has brought an emotional change. Her parish, Spring Valley Lutheran Church of rural Viborg, was destroyed by fire in spring 2010. The church was rebuilt and re-opened earlier this year.

Some costs remain from the fire, and Spring Valley is selling Sunday's lunch at the community center as a fundraiser, Hartmann said.

She found it difficult to describe the return to Spring Valley after a year's absence, spent with the sister congregation of Our Savior's Lutheran in Viborg.

"It was an amazing feeling, to be back in your own

"But when people walked into the new church (for Spring Valley), they went to the same pews where they sat before. It was like you had always been there."

It's that same spirit that makes Danish Viking Days and the rest of Viborg life so successful, Christensen said.

"It's not by luck but by hard work by a lot of people," he said. "There is pride in the town, and people are keeping a lot of that pride."

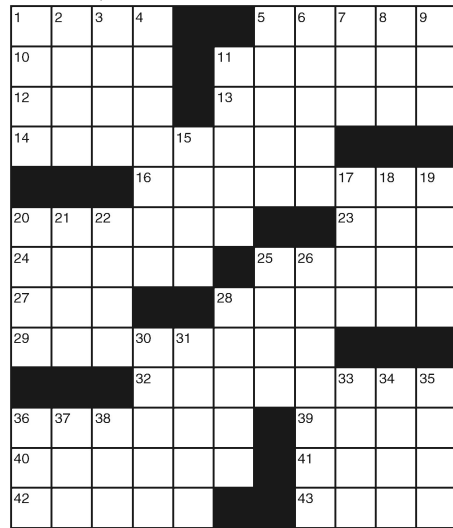
