Sen. Hunhoff Leads Health Care Policy Group

South Dakota Sen. Jean Hunhoff leading group of Midwestern lawmakers studying health care policy

Sen. Jean Hunhoff has been selected to lead a regional committee of state legislators that will examine key issues related to health care and human services. The goal of the committee is to promote interstate cooperation, collaborative policymaking and information sharing among the region's state lawmakers.

As a member of the bipartisan Midwestern Legislative Conference Health and Human Services Committee, Hunhoff will be working with leaders from 11 states and four Canadian provinces.

"This opportunity to serve as

co-chair will allow me to share concerns and issues from South Dakota, as well as to network with other state legislators to identify state initiatives that were worked to improve state-funded health and human services programs to achieve quality and cost effectiveness," Hunhoff said.

As part of her duties as co-chair of the committee, Hunhoff presided over the group's annual meeting in July. At that meeting, the committee discussed state strategies for achieving cost savings in Medicaid, opportunities for improving long-term care services and how states are putting in place health insurance exchanges under federal health care reform.

In the 2011-12 biennium, the committee plans to study improvements to behavioral health services; state implementation of federal health care reform; and ensuring quality home- and community-based care.

Lawmakers from the following states are members of the MLC: Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, Kansas, Michigan, Minnesota, Nebraska, North Dakota, Ohio, South Dakota and Wisconsin. In addition, members of the legislative assemblies in four Canadian provinces — Alberta, Manitoba, Ontario and Saskatchewan — are MLC affiliates. The Midwestern Office of The Council of State Governments provides staff support to the MLC and its policy committees.

FEMA Rejects Request For Individual Flood Assistance

PIERRE — Governor Dennis Daugaard received word today that the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) has rejected South Dakota's request for Individual Assistance programs to help residents impacted by record flooding.

The denial of Individual Assistance came in a letter from FEMA Administrator Craig Fugate, who said damage to homes and businesses fell short of the severity and magnitude to warrant federal assistance.

"Here in South Dakota, we all know that flooding has impacted thousands of residents and damaged hundreds of homes," said Kristi Turman, Director of the

South Dakota Office of Emergency Management. "Unfortunately, FEMA declined to find that we meet their requirements for Individual Assistance programs."

South Dakota has received a Presidential Disaster Declaration because of flood damage to public infrastructure in 37 counties. The State asked for a similar declaration to bring federal help to individuals in 11 counties hardest hit

by flooding in 2011.

Governor Daugaard called the denial very disappointing but said South Dakotans will continue to work together to help individuals and communities recover over the coming weeks and months.

"South Dakotans are a resilient, self-reliant people," Governor Daugaard said. "We responded to the flooding together. We will recover together. We will seek every possi-

ble source of help, including state and local government resources and all the resources the private and non-profit voluntary groups can offer. We are disappointed, but we are not disheartened."

The last time South Dakota qualified for a Presidential Disaster Declaration for individual assistance was in 2007, when early-May storms caused sudden, widespread flooding in the Aberdeen area.
