"With the corn, it's not a one-shot deal, but we need the pollen to shed when we go to start filling with the silking phase and making those kernels and their reproductive phase. If there is such a high heat, we could stifle it and stop it all together. We could have some abortion issues or some deformation because of it."

Although crops are an area of concern, other plants are also in danger with the above-average temperatures.

Strunk said it is important for gardeners to make sure their plants get enough moisture.

"They need that constant water flow," she said. "If they haven't gotten supplemental water, it's really a stressor on the plant, especially with tomatoes. You'll see some cracking or catfacing, some abortion or some smaller fruit."

Trees are not immune either, Strunk said.

"If you have young trees, they really need a lot of water, or you have a chance of losing them," she said. The leaves can also show some deformation because a lot of times if you don't get enough water, they're not moving enough nutrients through." While the forecast does not look promising, Strunk is hoping for the best. "A little bit of rain or some cool would be a nice relief for all," she said.
