Guide Gives Tips On Restoring Flooded Homes

BROOKINGS — A federal guidebook can help contractors and homeowners restore flood-damaged homes, a South Dakota State University specialist said. "Rehabilitating Flooded Houses: A Guide for Builders and Contractors" is available as a free download at this link: http://www.huduser.org/portal/publications/destech/rehab_flood_houses.html. It's also possible to order a hard copy from the same Web site for \$5. Professor Kim Cassel, SDSU coordinator for the Extension Disaster Education Network, said homes that have been under water for a sustained period of time present challenges to homeowners not typically seen in short-term flood events. The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development published the guide to discuss topics such as determining how badly a building has been damaged and how to make repairs, if repairable. The guidebook emphasizes safe practices and the most important activities in the rehab process. This guidebook is bilingual in English and Spanish. "It's intended for contractors, but homeowners are also encouraged to use the guide as a reference as they begin restoring flood-damaged homes," Cassel said. In addition to rehabilitating damaged homes, homeowners who experienced flooding are also dealing with mold cleanup.
