Slate For Park Service Bridge Walks Set

Rangers at Missouri National Recreational River will conduct walks to the historic Meridian Bridge and present short talks on a variety of subjects. The walks will begin at the Territorial Capitol replica in Yankton's Riverside Park at 11:30 a.m., 12:30 p.m. 3 p.m.

Upon reaching the bridge, the talks will last no more than 15 minutes, after which visitors may continue across the bridge, return to downtown Yankton, or chat with the ranger on the way back to the capitol. Rangers will be at the capitol replica from 10 a.m.-4 p.m. pm most weekdays to answer questions about the

river and provide information to visitors and the community.

This week's programs are as follows:

- Monday, July 9: "Simple Schemes to Sink a Steamboat" — The treacherous river and human errors sank hundreds of steamboats on the wild Missouri.
- Tuesday, July 10: "Not Just a River" — The National Park Service protects not just the Missouri River, but many other natural and cultural resources associated with the river. Discover the "outstandingly remarkable values" that led Congress to create the Missouri

National Recreational River.

- Wednesday, July 11: "The Missouri River: Connecting the Past and the Future" — How has the Missouri River changed and been changed over the centuries? What will the river be like in the future? Walk with a ranger and discover what changes and what remains the same.
- Thursday, July 12: "Crossing the Mighty Mo" — The wild Missouri was both a means of travel and an obstacle to it. Learn how fickle fortune and the river itself stood in the way of bridge building.

City To Consider Public Art Project

The Yankton City Commission will consider a request for an interactive community art project near the Meridian Bridge Monday. Yankton Area Arts is proposing that an 8-foot tall and 32-foot wide plywood wall be erected to the east of the north entrance of the lower level of the Meridian Bridge. "Before I Die..." will be stenciled in with blank lines for people to fill in their thoughts using chalk.

The initial proposal is for the project to stand for 30 days and then undergo a review.

Also Monday, the commission will consider entering an agreement with Bartlett & West, Inc., for design and bidding services related to a new wastewater lift station south of Highway 50 on the east side of Yankton. It would replace two older lift stations.

In other business, the commission will consider a permit to occupy right-of-way from Bernard Properties, an airport hangar land lease agreement for Hoffner Flying, Inc., and a request for no parking on portions of the east side of West City Limits Road between Eighth St. and Ninth St.

The meeting gets under way at 7 p.m. in the City of Yankton Meeting Room, located at the Technical Education Center, 1200 W. 21st St.

Railroad Crossings To Be Upgraded Near Lesterville And Tripp

Two railroad crossings over state highways are set to be upgraded over the next few weeks near Lesterville and Tripp, according to the South Dakota Department of Transportation.

Burlington Northern & Santa Fe Railroad crews are scheduled to upgrade the crossing on state Highway 46 northwest of Lesterville beginning Monday, July 16, and upgrade the crossing on Highway 18 beginning Monday, July 23.

The crossing surface will be removed and replaced with new concrete planks; it will take five days to complete each one.

Highway 46 traffic will be detoured around the work onto Menno Road — a Yankton-Bon Homme County road two miles north of Highway 46 and east of Highway 25.

Highway 18 traffic will be detoured on the county road just east of the crossing. Traffic will travel north two miles and west one mile to Highway 37.

Street-Coating Projects Begin Today

The City of Yankton Street Department will begin the street seal coat program the week of July 9 and should be completed in approximately one week, weather permitting.

Streets scheduled for sealing include the following:

- Pine Street — East 26th Street to Donohoe Blvd.;
- West 10th Street — Summit Street to Maple Street;
- West 13th Street — Summit Street to Spruce Street;
- West 14th Street — Summit Street to Spruce Street;
- West 16th Street — Locust Street to Linn Street;
- Linn Street — West 16th Street to West 17th Street;
- West 17th Street — Locust Street to Linn Street;
- East 16th Street — John Street to Cul-de-sac;
- East 21st Street — Douglas Avenue to Mulberry Street;
- Francis Street — Douglas Avenue to Donohoe Blvd.;
- William Circle — Cul-de-sac;
- Ella Lane — Cul-de-sac;
- Anna Street — Douglas Avenue to Francis Street;
- Mary Street — Anna Street to Donohoe Blvd.;
- Francis Street — Donohoe Blvd to E. 29th Street;
- Donohoe Blvd — Mary Street to Mulberry Street;
- Ruth Street — Lakeview Drive to East 29th Street;
- Applewood Drive — Ruth Street to Arlington Avenue;
- East 29th Street — Douglas Avenue to Belmont Avenue;
- Alley — Maple Street East to End/West 7th Street to West 8th Street;
- Alley — West 3rd Street to West 4th Street/Maple Street & Spruce Street;
- Alley — Maple Street to Spruce Street/West 3rd Street & West 4th Street;
- Alley — West 21st Street to West 22nd Street/Walnut Street & Douglas Avenue;
- Alley — West 20th Street to West 21st Street/Walnut Street & Douglas Avenue.

The process will be to oil the road and cover it with 3/8-inch chips. The streets will be closed to traffic during the seal coat process and opened to traffic immediately after the application. After one week, the street sweeper will pick up the excess chips that are still loose.

"No Parking" signs will be placed on the streets the day before they are sealed. Observe these signs and do not park on the streets until the work is done. Do not blow grass onto the street before the streets are sealed or permit underground irrigation systems to run water onto the streets while the No Parking signs are up. In the event of rain, the process may be postponed.

 • State Treasurer W. H. Hinselman today attributed a \$91,647.81 decline in motor fuel taxes during the fiscal year which ended June 30 to the legalization of the low flash tractor fuel law, poor crops last fall and adverse motoring weather last winter.

Monday, July 9, 1962
 • Fire of unknown origin destroyed the Ulrich Medicine Chest drugstore (in Avon) early Sunday morning and caused smoke and water damage to two adjoining buildings.
 • With a flash that lit the Hawaiian Islands like a giant flashbulb, a powerful nuclear device exploded high above Johnston Island, 750 miles southwest of here (Honolulu) Sunday night. It marked success by the United States on its third try to explode a nuclear warhead carried aloft by a giant Thor missile.
