hand-pumper and pull this hose guard, usually pulled by horses or themselves, and hook up to the hydrant and pumped the water by hand."

Wagner said although they do not have that piece of equipment, they do still have the original hose guards, which they had rebuilt for their 100th anniversary back in 1987.

"They also had an old chemical truck that was the second truck they owned," Wagner said. "We've also got an old 1927 Chevy fire truck that had three tanks on it that would dump the acid out of the water. It held 110 gallons between three tanks. We've also got some old pictures that go back to the first original firemen and then some that go

through the years that we'll have at the celebration."

Pesek said he is hoping not only for the Tyndall community to attend the celebration, but also for residents from surrounding areas to take part in the activities.

The Tyndall Fire Department currently has 31 members and is 100 percent volunteer, Pesek said. The celebration is a way of saying thank you to everyone who has supported the department, he said.

"This is kind of an appreciation to the community, too," he said. "They're a big part of what has kept us around for 125 years. We ask for donations every year and they supply us with a lot of the funds that keep this volunteer fire department going. A lot of the people in Tyndall have husbands or sons that may have served on the fire department and want to be present to show the monument that was erected in their name."

response to the death of 2-year-old Caylee Anthony, who wasn't reported missing until 31 days after she vanished in 2008 in Orlando.

The law makes the failure to notify law enforcement of death of a child a felony. Under the law, any parent, legal guardian or caretaker who knowingly fails to notify law enforcement within six hours of learning of the death of a minor child in his or her care is guilty of a Class 5 felony.

In the Wagner death, the Cournoyers' next expected court date is scheduled for 1 p.m. July 17 at the Charles Mix County Courthouse in Lake Andes.

Both Cournoyers are in custody in Charles Mix County, Rabern said.

The autopsy on the victim isn't complete at this time, Rabern said. Hein has said in media reports that the final results may not be known for a month.

An 11-year-old boy was taken into custody at the time of the victim's death and remains in custody, Rabern said.

No further information was available on whether the boy faces charges in the girl's death.

The state Division of Criminal Investigation (DCI) and the Charles Mix County Sheriff's Office have been investigating the case.

CHICAGO (AP) — Grains futures mostly fell Thursday on the Chicago Board of Trade.

Wheat for September delivery rose 20.50 cents to \$8.4675 a bushel; December corn jumped 29 cents to \$7.33 a bushel; December oats rose 5.75 cents to \$3.72 a bushel; while November soybeans rose 6.50 cents to \$15.29 a bushel.

Beef futures fell while pork futures rose on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange.

August live cattle slipped 0.98 cent to \$1.1702 a pound; August feeder cattle fell 3 cents to \$1.4122 a pound; while August lean hogs rose 0.97 cent to 92.27 cents a pound.

The report shows that June ended with a record of 25 births and 15 deaths.
