Anyone participating in athletics during the 2012-2013 school year must meet the following criteria before they may begin practice:


1. If a student will be in Grades 8, 9, 11 or 12 and PARTICIPATED in athletics in the 2011-2012 school year, they must fill out and return the Interim Pre-Participation History form to the Middle School Principal's Office or the High School Activities Director's Office. No School Activities Office.

2. If the athlete will be in Grades 7 or 10 or has never participate in the 2012-2013 school year, they must:

- a. Fill out an Initial Pre-Participation History form; and
- b. Have a physical taken at the Yankton Medical Clinic or have their personal health care provider complete their physical. There will be a flat fee of \$15.00 and the clinic will not file any insurance claims for the exam.

This must be done before any participation begins. Forms are available at the Yankton High School Activities Office or for Middle School students at the YMS Principal's Office.
